MILWAUKEE

In Milwaukee today President Ford said he expects Egypt and Israel to reach a new interim agreement - "in a week, at the latest."

ALEXANDRIA TEL AVIV

Secretary of State Kissinger met twice today with Egypt's President Sadat - and then it was back to Israel. Dr. Kissinger ^{is} said to be so close to a new interim peace agreement - that both Egypt and Israel are now working on proposed final drafts.

Meanwhile a speech by Israeli Foreign Minister Allon - saying Israel stands to gain more now than it could have gained through previous ~~the~~ bargaining. "Proposals the ~~Egyptians~~ Egyptians were not even prepared to consider in March" said he - "are now attainable. ~~in August.~~"

CHICAGO

Earlier today in Chicago today -
From President ~~Ford in Chicago~~ - a pledged

~~today~~ to fight for a reduction in government regulations
over private business. The President telling a
hardware industry convention: "My objective is to get
the federal government as far out of your business,
out of your lives, out of your pockets and out of your
hair - as I can. "

The President adding, "however, as government
regulations are ~~reduced~~ reduced we must make certain
our anti-trust laws are vigorously enforced." "It is
my job - and your job" he told the hardware
manufacturers - "to open up the market ~~place~~ place
to all comers."



DETROIT

Detroit - the nation's four major auto makers
today reported a sharp ^{up-turn in} ~~increase~~ ^{in mid-August} new
car sales. The ^{Sales} ~~mid-August~~ figure ^{for mid-August only} ~~was~~ six percent
below last year, ^{this} a near record ^{at a time} when buyers ^{have been} ~~are~~
attempting to beat coming price hikes. Indeed, Ford
actually topping its last year sales - for ~~only~~ the
second time in any ten day period since last October.

ZAMBEZI

In a luxury railroad car on a bridge over the Zambezi river - an attempt today to end nine years of racial confrontation. Rhodesian Prime Minister Ian Smith - conferring with a dozen members of Rhodesia's African National Council. The site of their meeting on the border-line between Rhodesia and Zambia - to prevent any tricks. But what, if anything, they've accomplished so far - it's hard to say. When asked how the talks were going - Smith saying: "Well they're going."

ATHENS

The death sentences of former Greek dictator George ~~Do~~ Papadopoulos and two of his key aides - were commuted today to life ~~imprison~~ imprisonment. This by order of the Greek government ~~is~~ leading to immediate protests by hundreds of leftist students at Athens University. A government spokesman insisting, however, the commutations were ~~just~~ justified. Adding that demonstrations against the Government's action - were merely aimed "at creating up ^{he}aval and causing political ~~passio~~ passions to flare."

SEOUL

Defense Secretary ~~James~~ Schlesinger flew today to Seoul - where he plans to take ~~up~~ part in the eighth annual U S-South Korea security meeting. On arrival ~~he~~ ^{said} ~~saying~~ the purpose of the meeting is to "discuss just what we need to do - to make our strength and ~~resolve~~ resolve so manifest" as to remove the threat of war.

ROCKEFELLER

Nelson Rockefeller will be heading South tomorrow

~~into hostile territory - in an effort~~ ^{hoping} to pick up some
converts to his Vice Presidential cause. Rockefeller
to speak at a Lieutenant Governor's conference in
Mobile - and then meet with top Republicans in
Alabama and South Carolina.

CHARLESTON

Hundreds of striking coal miners, whose wild-cat walkout has paralyzed much of the coal industry - paraded today through the streets of Charleston, West Virginia. This in defiance of a back to work order - from a federal judge. The strikers pledging to continue their walkout - pending a settlement of local grievances. Also, tying up traffic and scuffling with police, but generally peaceful - and there were no arrests.

DECATUR

A missing plane that carried two candidates
in an up-coming Mississippi election - was finally
found today in rugged terrain near Decatur, Mississippi.
Search units reporting - ~~there were~~ no survivors.

EARTHQUAKES

Here's ~~one~~ a report ^{that} ~~saying~~ an estimated
