MOSCOW

In the President's mission to Moscow - a signal breakthrough today; the first of many - we hope. That is, I hope we all hope so. President Nixon conferring at length - with Soviet Communist Party Leader Leonid Brezhnev; the two agreeing on - and later signing - a pair of bilateral accords: Thereby setting up the machinery - for a common battle against the ravishes of diseases such as cancer and heart trouble; also, a common battle - against environmental pollution. The Russians, as you have heard, hope to save the Caspian Sea, just as we would like to save Lake Erie and so on.

When viewed against an issue such as nuclear war - this, at first glance, may be not so much. Observers were quick to note, ~~however,~~ however, that medical research and environmental protection - are issues which do affect all citizens. President Nixon himself saying: "These are good things to start with." Best of all perhaps, Brezhnev

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throwing his arm around the President - as they left again for additional talks; a show of U.S. and Russian comraderie - unparalleled since the days of World War II.

And now the latest: A report tonight that the U.S. and Russia have finally reached agreement - on a long sought nuclear arms limitation pact. Official signing - set for Friday - we are told. If true, another giant step - on the road to world peace.

ANOTHER MOSCOW NOTE: THE PRESIDENT'S PERSONAL FLIGHT CREW--LEFT WITH LITTLE TO DO THIS WEEK; AND SO THE PRESIDENT'S PILOT--COLONEL RALPH ALBERTAZZIE--ASKING IF THERE WASN'T SOME PLACE WHERE HE AND HIS MEN COULD WORK OUT. "MAYBE A LITTLE SOCCER FIELD"--SAID HE. NO SOONER SAID--THEN DONE.
