They apparently were not consulted although US and Allied commanders - also the Viet Cong - are all expected to go along.

Thieu's reason for making the announcement as he did - es seen as two-fold:- First - an effort to emphasize again - his independence of U S authority; second, to blunt the Viel Cong's assertion - that they the Corg, are the true "peace seekers" in Vietnam.

Meanwhile - U.S. and North Vietnamese officials hard at work, Frying to hammer out basic conference protocol - Fren as seating, order of arrival, departure and so on. With agreement - expected shortly. Here may be netsing hoped for a first meeting of that expanded peace parley perhaps as early as next Wednesday.

VIETNAM FOLLOW PARIS

Be that as it may - it's still business as usual in the fighting zone. Today's business - including a deadly game of cat-and-mouse south of Da Nang, with a force of U.S. Marines - attempting to encircle an estimated three thousand Viet Cong - Hoping to write a smashing climax to Operation Meade - which began about two weeks ago.

Object: To obliterate enemy units - who have dominated the area for years. And so far - it seems to be working. The Marines killing some four hundred capturing scores more since the drive began. But those who are still left under orders to "fight to the death" -

On that other Eastern front - in Europe - Russia raises the threat of a return to "cold war times." The wording contained in a protest note - delivered today to the British Ambassador to Moscow. Accusing Britain of using Soviet occupation of Czechoslovakia - as a "pretext" to aggravate relations between East and West.
