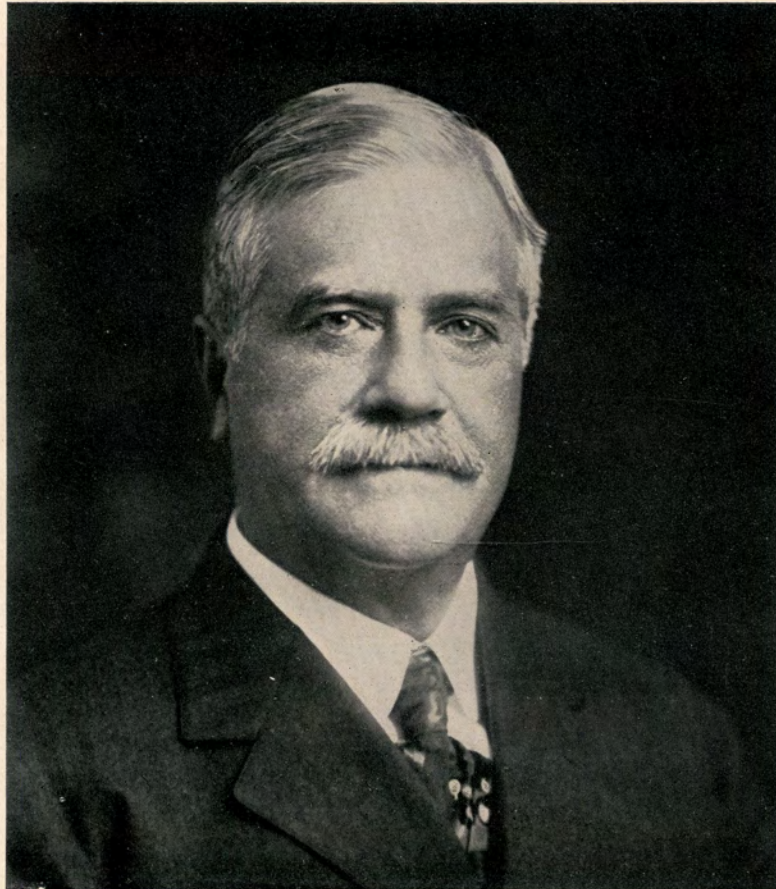

THE COACHES



GLENDON, OF COLUMBIA

Richard J. Glendon became crew coach at Columbia after a successful career at the Naval Academy, where he first assisted his father, Richard A. Glendon, and later was head coach. Since 1926 Glendon's Columbia crews have won two Varsity championships at Poughkeepsie—1927 and 1929—and finished second once, forcing California to set a new four-mile record to defeat them in 1928.



WRAY, OF CORNELL

Before coming to Cornell in 1926, James Wray had many successful seasons as a coach, particularly at Harvard, where his crews won a record of six consecutive victories over Yale. He found Cornell rowing at a low ebb, but after 6 short years has made the Red and White Navy a serious eastern contender.



CALLOW, OF PENNSYLVANIA

Russell S. Callow, serving his fifth year as head coach of rowing at Pennsylvania, was captain of crew at the University of Washington in 1915, his senior year there. After graduating, "Rusty" coached Washington crews to many triumphs, including several at Poughkeepsie. This season has been his most successful at Pennsylvania, with three Varsity victories in four races and an undefeated Freshman crew.

**TEN EYCK,
OF SYRACUSE**

James A. Ten Eyck has become a permanent part of the rowing tradition at Syracuse, where he has made the sport popular and successful for over a quarter of a century. Probably the only active collegiate rowing coach of the old school, he retains, at 82, all the vigor and keenness of mind that marked his own rowing days of more than fifty years ago.



WALSH, OF NAVY

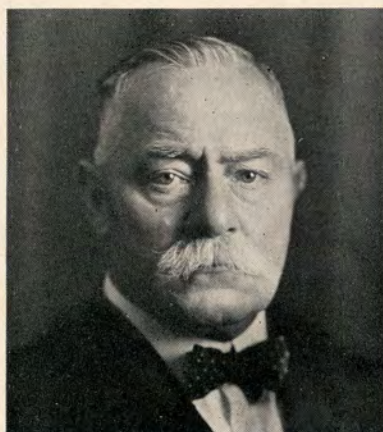
C. S. "Buck" Walsh is serving his first year as head coach of rowing at the Naval Academy. A former Navy oarsman and a graduate of the Academy in 1923, he returned to Annapolis as assistant crew coach in 1924. In 1926 he was named coach of the freshman crew, and was appointed head crew coach this season.

EBRIGHT, OF CALIFORNIA

Carroll "Ky" Ebright, now in his ninth year as head crew coach at California, learned rowing as a coxswain at the University of Washington. Perhaps his major achievement at California was in 1928, when his Varsity defeated thirteen American, Canadian and European crews at all distances from 2,000 meters to four miles, to win the undisputed championship of the world. This year his Varsity and Junior Varsity defeated Washington by 18 and 6 lengths respectively.



HAINES, OF M.I.T.

Bill Haines came to Tech in 1924, after seven years as head coach at Harvard. Before that, he was known as one of the best oarsmen in England. During his first years at M.I.T. he had many difficulties to overcome, but each year the quality and popularity of rowing at Tech improved under his supervision. Two years ago his Varsity crew finished third at Poughkeepsie, after leading the field for the first two miles.



ULBRICKSON, OF WASHINGTON

Alvin Ulbrickson is a product of the University of Washington, where he stroked the Varsity in '24, '25 and '26, during which time Washington twice won the Varsity race at Poughkeepsie. In 1927 he became assistant to Callow at Washington, and was appointed head coach that fall. He hit his stride in 1930 to take a three-way sweep from California, followed in 1931 by another three-way victory that set new Coast records for Varsity, Jayvee and Freshman rowing.
