McCarthy mentioned that he campaigned for Eisenhower during the presidential election. Did so because he was convinced that General Ike would lead a vigorous fight against Communism. "Unfortunately, in this I was mistaken." That was the way he summed it up today.

Pointing out that his Committee work had been held up by the Sensure issue - McCarthy accused President Eisenhower Eisenhouer of congratulating Senators Flanders and Watkins the leaders in pushing through the condemnation of McCarth in the Senate. So he believes that the President is indirectly responsible for holding up the investigation of Communism.
