The White House - a dissertation today on winning and losing - from a man who has had his share of both. There she is was joined by Governor Rockefeller, Mayor Lindsay and a host of others from almost every walk of life who were paying tribute to a woman who charmed everyone she knew. INDO CHINA

In the fighting in Southeast Asia - a sudden flare up of action is reported today from all three countries involved. This including a US air strike - against Communist gun positions in North Vietnam; the first such raid - in nearly a month; also, a string of Communist successes in Cambodia - prompting South Vietnam to send five thousand more men into that country; while the government of Laos ^{Mag} a setback of **w** its own **success** forced to declare a state of emergency in six southern provinces.

NEW DELHI FOLLOW INDO CHINA

On the political front though - perhaps a ray of hope. This in the form of a statement today in New Delhi - from Madame Nguyen Thi Binh, the visiting foreign minister of the Viet Cong provisional government; who declared the Communists would be "willing" to form a broad-based coalition government in South Vietnam - including some members of the present Saigon regime -- once the Americans have left.

Madame Binh thus departing from past Communist insistence - that no member of the present Saigon 📾 government could serve in a coalition. She even went so far as to say today - that except for President Thieu and a few others - the "majority' of the Saigon regime does believe in peace, independence and neutrality."

CAIRO

In the Middle East - a meeting today between Egyptian Foreign Minister Mahmoud Riad and the chief of the US Mission to Cairo. Donald Bergus receiving Egypt's formal reply - to the latest U.S. plan for solving the Arab-Israeli impasse; a reply as yet secret - that he quickly relayed to US officials in Washington.

However, the Egyptian government later disclosing - its response was "positive". This said to mean that Egypt is ready to discuss the American proposal further - and not reject it out of hand. Cairo adding that Egypt's Colonel Nasser - will deliver a major address tomorrow at noon; one that may shed additional light - on the mathematic outlook for peace in that part of the world. At any rate, Israel reserving its own formal reply to the American plan - at least, until Nasser finets down.

ATHENS

Meanwhile a tense human drama -- was being enacted today at Athens airport. Six Arab guerrillas - seizing an Olympic Airways jet for seven hours - holding as hostages the fifty eight aboard. Until the government of Greece agreed, at last, to release seven Arab commandos - who had been jailed earlier for acts against Israel.

That done, the guerrillas releasing all

LA PAZ FOLLOW ATHENS

In the same vein - this next from LaPaz where the government of Bolivia agreed today to release ten political prisoners - in exchange for two German technicians who were kidnapped earlier by left wing extremists. President Alfredo Ovando also pledging to give the leftists safe passage out of the country - once they have freed their hostages.

One crisis apparently ended though -- another was fast developing; with right wing extremists armed with bombs and submarine guns - today invading Bolivia's National University - which is ulso locutation La Paz. The right wingers thereby defying a government imposed state of siege, or modified martial law, - which had been declared only a few hours earlier. LONDON

Over In London - the leadership of Britain's striking Longshoremen's union finally bowed today to government pressure. Faced with the threatened use of federal troops - age agreeing that workers themselves should unload the vital foodstuffs; those that are now in danger of spoiling; on the nation's strike bound docks.

AVALANCHE

The awesome power of thet avalanche triggered by the great Peruvian earthquake of last May - fully detailed for the first time today in Wooden Washington.
