Sex and violence on TV <sup>was</sup> again the target of  
an attack today from the federal communications  
commission; ~~this~~ in a special report to Congress.  
The F C C noting a record number of complaints in the  
past year - over, "quote, "violent or sexually  
oriented programs." Adding that obscene and indecent  
materials are already banned by law from radio;  
but when ~~it~~ it comes to TV - the law is vague; for  
these reasons, said the F C C - "we will include  
in our legislative proposals for action by this  
Congress - an amendment <sup>to</sup> ~~which would~~ eliminate this  
uncertainty."

Detroit - the Ford Motor Company <sup>b</sup> ~~today reported~~  
~~its annual~~ earnings last year, - ~~at~~ three hundred and  
sixty-one million; ~~This a sixty percent drop from the~~  
~~previous record year - also, the~~ lowest ~~figure~~ for any  
non-strike year since nineteen fifty-eight.

From the U S Census Department - <sup>comes a</sup> ~~drop~~ report

average American family. Five years ago <sup>it was</sup> ~~λ~~ three -  
point ~~in~~ one-nine persons per household; ~~where~~ now  
~~is~~ <sup>down to</sup> ~~only~~ ~~λ~~ two-point-nine-seven. ~~per household~~. The  
drop blamed on "recent increases in the number of  
people living alone - ~~coupled with~~ <sup>and</sup> a declining birth rate."

a high conscience for his mission." Adding that the  
facts of his death - whatever they might be - "cannot  
discredit the testimony of an entire life."
