Just after the first contingent of American troops left Saigon, the Communists launched a series of rocket attacks only three miles from the heart of the city. No casualties, but the rockets set fire to a fuel storage tank, sending flames into the night sky and casting a flickering glow on cityes streets. The attack came as allied military sources predicted renewed viet Cong terrorism on the heels of American troop withdrawals.

General John P. McConnell, Air Force Chief of Staff - told a Senate committee meeting today that North Vietnam has repaired at least seventy-five percent of the damage Inflicted by American bombing Said he - "practically everything in North attacks. -said he -Vietnam has been rebuilt - highways, bridges and what little industry they have wheth which isn't much." McConnell estimates the repairs were made within five months after a total bombing halt was ordered last October. He also says the Communists are now moving supplies with impunity and that Allied troops are "more in jeopardy" as a result.

Israeli and Syrian jet fighters - staging a spectacular battle at super-sonic speed, high in the skies over their common border today. Biggest air battle since the Middle East War two years ago. Both sides give conflicting reports -- the Israelis claiming seven Syrian Migs were shot down and all Israeli planes returned safely. In Damascus, a Syrian spokes man admits losing three planes, but says four Israeli jets were shot down in a ninety-minute battle. Both sides also reported ground fighting during the day, including Egyptian commando strikes and artillery duels across the Suez and when along the Jordan.
