LISBON

A massive uprising by left wing troops and civilians today threatened to topple the moderate government of Portugal. The leftists seizing control of national radio and TV in Lisbon - also, occupying four major military bases; calling for a general strike and other measures - aimed at forcing the government to resign. This in protest
(Car-val-yo)
over the ouster of leftist General Carvalho.

President Costa Gomes instead of surrendering to the rebels declared a state of national emergency - put all remaining troops on war alert and ordered the leftists to surrender - or else. His loyalists troops then moved in and crushed the revolt with virtually no opposition; and put General Carvalho under arrest - for inspiring the uprising.

NEW MADRID

From Madrid comes word that Spain's new king, Juan Carlos the First - has pardoned many political prisoners ~~now held in Spanish jails~~; and has also abolished the death penalty for crimes committed before his coronation. A government spokesman saying this ~~was being done~~^{is} in line with the late Generalissimo Franco's last political ~~dec~~ testament - in which he said he forgave all his enemies.
