Has the upturn finally begun? The answer the Commerce Department says a tentative yes; because the
nation's index of leading economic indicators jumped last
month a resounding four-point-one percent; biggest monthly
increase - since they first started keeping such figures.

Commerce spokesman James Pate saying: "The size and breadth of the increases is encouraging and with other evidence - suggests that the recession has reached bottom.

Treasury Secretary Simon - in Paris, even more exhuberant, was telling a meeting of the Organization for Economic Cooperation and Development that there are clear-cut signs of recovery in the U.S. Economy. Adding: At the rate shown in our official forecasts the U.S. growth rate may be the highest among member countries - during the second half of this year.
