GOOD EVENING EVERYBODY:

The news of another Eisenhower-Kennedy meeting before inauguration day - means one thing. A transfer of presidential power with much less animosity than so often in the past. Remember the ill-feeling - when Eisenhower took over from Truman. And early in our history there was that classical case - of John Quincy Adams refusing even to meet Andrew Jackson.

President Eisenhower tonight, along with a thousand Republicans at a banquet, is celebrating Vice President Nixon's forty-eighth birthday. An ironic celebration, in a way - since Dick Nixon will become a private citizen in eleven days. The price of losing the election by an eye lash.

The Vice President held a small party in his office - earlier in the day; entertaining - the members of his staff. For this reason he wasn't in the Senate to hear the Senators who rose one after the other to praise the young statesman who has presided over their deliberations for the past eight years.

Kerner, inaugurated - as two temporary speakers sat on the rostrum, handling the gavel in turn.

No direct connection - with the dispute between Havana
