Mrs. Nixon also said she was able to spend her time in China - just as she had hoped - mingling with the people and seeing the historic sites of China. Kennedy opened hearings today <sup>4</sup> on the subject of possible amnesty for Viet Nam draft evaders. But in January when Brazil's President Medici was here he assured me the time had come to take a look at Brasilia where in ten years the population has jumped from zero to over four hundred thousand.*

bizarre shaped buildings. For instance, the home of their  
Lower House of Parliament from a hundred yards away looks  
like a great open dish. Inside where the legislators meet  
there's a hall large enough to accommodate several thousand.

legislation originating in the Lower House. Between the
