Paraphrasing Kipling, You might say-they
worshipped Stalin as the "great god bud." but now
they say-he was "an idol made of mud."

At the news conference, one of the reporters asked Maleknov-what must have been a touchy question. Did he have any feeling of guilt, over the great blood purges, in which Stalin killed off enemies? Malenkov and his Krelmin colleagues, then so close to Stalin.

They now say he was-a homicidal maniac.

Al, But they participated-as the faithful henchmen of Stalin.So-does Malenkov feel at all guilty about it?

His reply was hidden in the usual Soviet verbiage.

He said: "with collective leadership, we always feel responsible for the shortcomings and errors we have made-and we openly admit them."

Which might seem to call wholesale murder"shortcomings and errors." Pleading guilty-in those
innocuous terms.

Meanwhile, the Chinese communists have joined-the anti-Stalin parade. Echoing, for the first time-the Moscow denunciation of the "cult of the individual."

The Austrian government is protesting to
