Compromise on Capitol Hill. Before he was done - the Vice President also scored the tactics of certain anti-war protestors. This in the form of a list he called - the "Ten Commandments of Protest." Among them - the following:

"Thou shalt not allow thy opponent to presents. speak - thou shalt not set forth a program of thine own - thou shalt not heed the lessons of history - thou shalt not revere any but totalitarian heroes." And finally this last: "Thou shalt not ask forgiveness for thy transgressions - rather thou shalt demand amnesty."

TUYEN BINH

War news from Vietnam - marked today by a series of human wave assaults near the Cambodian border; with a horde of enemy soldiers - attempting to over-run a South Vietnamese outpost at Tuyen Binh an outpost whose garrison numbered a mere hundred access coasts and sixty men.
