The President's address set for nine-thirty tonight - Eastern time. You will hear it right here on many of these CBS stations.

Earlier in Warsaw - a final series of talks with Polish ~~etc~~ leaders and then - the signing of a joint communique. The U S and Poland pledging a joint effort to achieve a mutual reduction of forces in Central Europe - as soon as practicable.

Also, setting up a joint ~~economic~~ commission - to "conduct periodic consultations" on the complex matter of trade.

The President further inviting the three top Polish leaders - to come and visit the U S and they, in turn - ^{as they put it -} accepting "with pleasure."

While all this was going on Pat Nixon was attending an open air Chopin concert after which - a ~~25~~ bit of a tiff with Polish security guards. They kept pushing people away, ~~with~~ The First Lady finally saying: "Goodness, I've never seen such ^{as this!} people."

~~Whereupon~~ Whereupon she elbowed her way through -- very ladylike of course - launching her own people to people program. And, whatever the guards may have thought - the Polish people loved it.

Dozens of wdl-wishers shaking her hand.

Little children ~~giving~~ giving her carnations - in exchange for hugs and kisses. When one woman asked: "Is it also possible to see the President?" -- Mrs. Nixon explaining there just wasn't enough time - and she hugged her too.

QUANG TRI

In Vietnam - a surprise thrust today - by South Vietnamese paratroopers and ~~the~~ rangers backed by tanks. The government troops - driving almost to the border of occupied Quang Tri province attempting to knock out a North Vietnam ~~army~~ regiment - and thereby thwart an expected attack on nearby Hue.

At the same time - in Saigon - the receipt of a current issue of Hanoi's official army newspaper Quan Doi Nhan Dan, ^{in which they} ~~this~~ ~~are~~ admitting that U S air strikes against North Vietnam are seriously hurting the Communist war effort - adding that, indeed, the maintenance of communications and supply lines - is becoming most "strenuous."

Meanwhile, the U S command today ordering^{ed}
the withdrawal of nearly twenty-five hundred additional
U S fighting men. This in keeping with President
Nixon's pledge - to reduce U S man power in Viet Nam
to just forty-nine thousand by the end of June.

As for U S casualties - another ten last
week; ~~which is still~~ - ten too many, of course.

And yet - a ~~tabulation~~ tabulation for the first five months
of the current year - showing losses less than
fifteen percent of ~~those of~~ a year ago. An indication
perhaps that Communist offensive or no - Vietnamization
is succeeding.

she. Adding "I think the only thing that would ever
really make him want to try to walk again - is his
career and his position."
