For one thing he asserted that France will pull out of the North Atlantic Freaty Organization -- by April, Nineteen Sixty-Nine. Two -- that Interior Minister General Mohammed Oufkir of Morocco -- was personally responsible for the celebrated kidnapping of Moroccan opposition leader Mehdi-Ben-Barka. And three -- that the only way to peace in Viet Nam -- is through a reconvening of the Nineteen-Fifty-Four Geneva Peace Conference.
