GOOD EVENING EVERYBODY:

We hear now that President Eiwenhower probably will attend the next session of the U.M. General Assembly - and not meet with Khrushchev. That direct from the President - at today's news conference. That direct from the President - at today's news conference. The President says he wants to address the General Assembly - on major international issues; but he rules out any conference with Khrushchev - unless the boss of the Kremlin agrees to our conditions. One of which is - the release of those two American survivors of the B-47 that the Russians shot down over international waters.

President Eisenhower also condemned Khrushchev for aggravating the Congo crisis. He pointed out that the Soviets are trying to undermine - the authority of the United Nations in the Congo; and, turn the Congo into - a Soviet satellite.

ADD EISENHOWER

There was an interesting development - at this presidential news conference. The man from "Tass" asked the President **Hyperhoner** a question. Mikhail Sagetlyan, wanting to know - what disarmament proposals the President has for the U.N. Mr. Eisenhower, reacted to this particular questioner as he would to anyone else. Replying, that this country is ready to continue - the efforts we've already made. But we re standing firm on our demand - that any disarmament agreement be guaranteed by a mutual inspection system.

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TRAITORS

Asked about Mitchell and Martin - President Eisenhower said their case proves that we must constantly check - our security regulations. And Chairman Carl Vinson of the House Armed Services Committee has ordered - a full investigation of our Intelligence agencies.

The two traitors who defected to Russia - are in for a rude awakening, according to the man who handled our Moscow Fair. Gilbert Robinson terms "fantastic" - the assertion by Mitchell and Martin, that ideas are freely exchanged in the Soviet Union. The monolithic tyranny of the Kremlin is so oppressive that Russian visitors to the Fair asked Robinson if they could snuggle them through the Iron Curtain to freedom. One Moscow family even wanted to be crated up - and shipped to America with our exhibits. He adds that if the two turn-coats are looking for freedom they won't find much of it in Moscow.

CONGO

That was an extraordinary session - in Leopoldville today. The Congolese Chamber of Deputies - voting both ways. It supported Premier Lumumba - by cancelling his dismissal from office. Then it turned around and supported President Kasavubu - by cancelling his dismissal. A stand-off between the two men - who head the government of the Congo Republic. Lumumba has again attacked - the U.N. This time for closing the airfields and shutting down the radio station.

Meanwhile - savage fighting continues in Kasai Province. And Katanga is still waiting - for Lumumba's invasion.

KENNEDY

The Democratic candidate for president campaigned along the west coast today - repeating his theme about our "new frontier". Senator Kennedy referring to his own strategy - for exploring this Twentieth Century frontier, repeated that we need a stronger Defense Department - and more spending on science. The Senator from Massachusetts also emphasized the need to raise our prestige - among the nations of the world. Do something about the wave of anti-Americanism from Cuba to Japan.

NIXON FOLLOW KENNEDY

And the Republican candidate, is talking about science - too. Or, writing about it - in another "position paper." Vice President Nixon proposes - a new program of basic research. "Basic" - meaning more theory. Nixon thinks we've been too interested - in practical work. And will need more men of ideas - if we are to stay ahead of the Russians. First step in the Nixon plan - have Congress authorize the National Science Foundation to sponsor basic research of the most advanced type. The Vice President is preparing to leave Walter Reed and Monday - the start 🛫 a nine thousand Hospital - on Saturday. mile campaign swing through the States.

INTEGRATION

The integration of a public school in Pine Bluff, Arkansas - took place so quietly, the youngsters hardly noticed it. Six year old Dolores Jean York entered a first grade classroom in Dollarway School - and slipped into a seat. She went through the morning lesson - and later had lunch in the school cafeteria. Said one Pine Bluff official - "It was very normal."

STORM

Tonight the east coast of Florida is all set for an unwelcome visitor, Hurricane "Donna", the storm that left Puerto Rico with more than a hundred dead, and thousands injured, and homeless. Huge damage. At the moment, Donna is on her way up "missile alley" - the Atlantic path followed by our Canaveral rockets.

OLYMPICS

At the Rome Olympics - the fans stayed later than usual tonight. Center of attraction - Don Bragg of Pennsville, Targen New Jersey. They called Don, "Garson" and the holds the world record for the pole vault. Today, "Tarzan" Bragg won a gold medal, a setting a new Olympic record - fifteen feet, five and one-eighth inches.

After that, he kept raising the bar - shooting at his world record - fifteen feet, nine and a quarter inches. The crowd - stayed with him. And groaned with disappointment when he didn't quite make it.

A number of Americans - did well today. Al Oerter of West Babylon, New York, led an American sweep of the discus throw - by hurling the platter a-hundred-and-ninety-four-feet, -two-inches - breaking his own Olympic record. Chuck Vinci of Cleveland took a gold medal - in weight-lifting. George O'Day did the same - in yacht racing. And our women's four hundred meter relay team, led by spectacular Wilma Rudolph a ran-off with a gold medal - a new Olympic record of forty-four and four-tenths seconds.

STONEHENGE

A dispatch from Salisbury, England - states that ten skeletons were found today - in a common grave. Sounds like - an atrocious murder case. But this is a case for archeologists. The skeletons - are almost four thousand years old.

At Stonehenge - most mysterious of all British antiquities, there is that circular pattern of massive stone blocks - over which the antiguarians have been puzzling ever since the Middle Ages.

The best guess is that Stonehenge was built by Celtic Druids - in pre-Roman times. The stone blocks, forming - a kind of open air temple; an amphitheatre where the Druids performed their magical rites including human sacrifice.

Where those giant stones came from - and how were they moved, no one knows.

But we may learn more about the ancient Druids now that ten of their skeletons have been unearthed.

FLEAS

Professor R. J. Goulding - biologist at Oregon State College, has a real claim to the title - "a dog's best friend." He's just developed - an anti-flea serum. A mixture of chemicals - to be added to dog food. When a pooch has finished his meal - the serum circulates through his system, and is fatal to any flea that happens to be bothering your pooch, Dick. A brave new world without fleas for Fido and Fifi.

WOMEN

In Indianapolis, Ralph Elvers of a manufacturing company said today - "I'm flabbergasted - I thought I was doing my patriotic duty."

What was that? Why, Elvers ordered his employees to vote. Said - they could have time off to register. He even offered - to provide transportation.

But the boss reckoned - without his feminine employees. Six women of the Company - immediately resigned. They say they're not going to take an order like that.

The resignation - caught the boss by surprise. And he must have been even more surprised - when the full story came out. All six of the aggrieved ladies - have registered. All six say - they intend to vote.
