RAWALPINDI

Apparently a broken man - in spirit and health -Ayub Khan bows to the inevitable. The Pakistani President - a virtual dictator for the past ten years - announcing today his planned withdrawal from public office. Paving the way for election of a new President - early in Nineteen-Seventy.

Reason - as you no doubt know - the combined opposition of both right and left wing opposition parties. Reflected in a series of nationwide riots - that have already claimed the lives of some sixty persons. A situation that has carried Pakistan to "the verge of insanity" - said the President. Further calling on both sides - to join now in preventing a civil war.

You may recall - Ayub 's offered to resign before. The last time - in the wake of that Indo-Pakistani war of Nineteen-Sixty-Five - when he later "forced" himself

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to reconsider. However, his decision today - "final and irrevocable" - said he. At age sixty-one - reportedly the victim of a serious lung ailment - Ayub Khan deciding at last - the time has come. And there is dancing tonight in the streets of Karachi, Dacca, **R**awalpindi.

JERUSALEM

In the tense Middle East - provocation was piled on provocation today. With a bomb exploding in a supermarket - in the Jewish section of Jerusalem. Killing two - injuring some thirty- most of them women and children.

A few hours later - Jerusalem warning that all Arab countries - must "bear responsibility" for Palestinian terrorist acts. Adding that Israel's "arm - is not short." Raising the threat of possible retaliation - against a number of Arab nations.

At the same time - the Arabs Fatah commando organization was also taking note of the situation. Telling Arab terrorists, in substance, to stop harrassing civilians - and start concentrating on military targets. "All in any other direction" - said Al Fatah.

KANSAS CITY

At Kansas City, Missouri - Harry Truman fights back from a bout with "acute gastroenteritis" - otherwise known as the flu. According to doctors - the eighty-fouryear-old ex-President is "resting comfortably" and "regaining strength." With all signs - pointing toward a speedy recovery. Good news.

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SAIGON

On the war front - Saigon - General Creighton Abrams today reports "massive evidence" - that the Communists arc attempting to mount another major offensive. Apparent goel - said the U.S. commander - "to show that they are omni-present;" in hopes of further influencing - Paris peace talks.

The enemy's timetable - as yet uncertain - said General Abrams. Adding, however, that he believed Saigon would be spared this time. Main reason: It's too well defended.

PARIS FOLLOW SAIGON

Meanwhile, in Paris - a heretofore secret Viet Cong document was made public today. Strongly attacking Henry Kissinger - President Nixon's chief adviser on foreign policy.

Kissinger's Vietnam strategy - aimed chiefly "at prolonging the war" - said the Viet Cong. Adding: "It will certainly bring the Americans - nothing good."

Here's one - perhads of special interest to nagging wives - their husbands, too. A story today - from Redwood City, California; where convicted wife-killer Earl Grover was permitted to plead guilty to a reduced charge of manslaughter. His sentence promptly set at one year the least he could get.

Earl Grover orightally indicted for murder - freely admitting he shot and killed his wife Shirley Anne. However, Judge Conrad Reisch agreeing to the lesser charge - on the basis of truth serum tests administered the defendant. The judge ruling, in effect: She drove him to it.

VALLEY FORGE

Retired four-star General Harold K. Johnson winner of this year's prestigious George Washington Award presented annually by the FreedomsFoundation. Announcement today - from Valley Forge, Pennsylvania; where the official presentation will take place tomorrow - as usual, on Washington's Birthday.

General Johnson - a survivor of the infamous Bataan "death march." Later becoming - U.S. Army Chief of Staff. Now cited for "a lifetime of exemplary character - earnest scholarship - superior leadership;" while serving his country thirty-five years - "with bravery and distinction - in peace and war."

WASHINGTON FOLLOW VALLEY FORGE

Speaking of Washington's Birthday - a new book just out. "Aspire to the Heavens" - by Washington scholar Mary Higgins Clark. A veritable treasure of little-known fact - about the nation's first "first family."

For example, the "Father of O_ur Country" was widely acclaimed - in his younger days - as the greatest dancer in all Virginia. Thanks, in part, to the tutelage of Sally Fairfax - wife of one of Washington's best friends; who was for a time - the woman he worshipped from afar. Then along came that pretty widow - Martha Custis; or "Patsy" - as he called her. Proving the perfect mate for the man who would become the first President. Indeed, she was there at this side - even at Velley Forge.

MOUNT VERNON FOLLOW WASHINGTON

By the way - Martha Washington was later to become famous in her own right. Hosting enormous parties serving tremendous meals for the countless guests who thronged to Mount Vernon.

One of her standby recipes - which recently came to light - that for a so-called "great cake." Ingredients including forty eggs - four pounds of butter - four pounds of sugar - five pounds of flour - plus a half-pint of French wine. The resulting batter - seasoned to taste with French brandy.

That from Martha Washington - America's first "hostess with the mostest."

CAPE KENNEDY

At Cape Kennedy - the pressure begins to build. With America's three Apollo-Nine astronauts - today completing a dress rehearsal for their upcoming space chase. Clearing the way for start of the final countdown in just a few hours - followed, hopefully, by blast-off a week hence.

Meanwhile, Apollo=Eight Commander Frank Borman was returning today from his goodwill trip to Europe. Getting a welcome-home and a well-done from President Nixon - also, Vice President Agnew.
