SILVER SPRING

Good Evening: Governor George Wallace recuperating
in the hospital in Silver Spring, Maryland - was encouraged
this morning by his primary victories in Michigan and

Maryland. He asked for a newspaper first thing. With his
doctor's approval - he scanned the accounts of yesterday's balloting.

Wallace later talking with his news secretary

Billy Joe Camp - who asked him: "Howe'd you like the vote in Michigan?" Wallace firing right back: "What's the
latest percentage?" When he was told - fifty-one-per cent

- Wallace adding: "Go out get me my latest vote total."

But later in the day - a somewhat discouraging report from one of the doctors attending the governor who said - the chances are less than fifty-fifty that Wallace will ever walk again - and if he does - it probably will be only with the aid of leg braces.

The Doctor - James Galbraith - a neurosurgeon
of the Univer sty of Alabama - noted that Wallace still has n't regained any feelings in his legs - because of a bullet lodged near the spinal column - and said - the longer he goes without improvement - the worse are the chances for an eventual recovery in his legs.
At any rate - it'll be some time before they know.

Another operation in a week or ten days - to remove that
bullet - and then another three months or more before Wallace can recover - to whatever extent is possible.

As promised, the U.S. today spelled out at paris its reasons for refusing a resumption of peace talks. A
formal notice delivered to the Communist side saying:
"Your actions on the battlefield and your words in Paris give no indication whatsoever that you are seriously interested in the negotiation of matters of substance." The U.S. adding - we "can only conclude that you have no serious purpose in demanding another plenary session."

In Vietnam the fighting goes on; with enemy forces stepping up their pressure today - on Kontum and Pleiku in the Central Highlands of South Vietnam. While
government troops - continued building what they called "a ring of steel" - around Hue. They took over a second abandoned base above Hue - eight Soviet warships reputedly have now assembled about two hundred miles off the coast of Vietnam. But the Russians are said to have shown no sign, as yet - that they intend to challenge the U.S. blockade of North Vietnam. At least one source observing: "They could just be engaged in muscle-flexing - sitting out there to let the U.S. know - that the Soviet Union also has a powerful fleet."

> From the Kremlin today - a tentative itinerary
for President Nixon's upcoming mission to Moscow. The schedule starting out with formal arrival ceremonies set for Monday at Moscow's Vnukovo-Two Airport. From Tuesday through Friday - private talks with top Kremlin leaders, especially Chairman Brezhnev. Saturday - a side trip to Leningrad. Sunday - a return to Moscow for final talks. And then - brief stops at Kiev and Tehran, en route home.

By the way, the Soviet newspaper - Pravda explained today why the President's visit is still on, Vietnam withstanding. Pravda saying: "The Soviet Union attaches considerable importance - to the development of equal, mutually advantageous relations with the U.S."
