So now Khrushchev answered Dulles - in a letter to the British publication. A long letter - nine thousand words long. The gist of it - as follows:

"We agree to discuss the question of cosmic space,

which is, in fact, the question of intercontinental ballistic rockets. But this question, "Khrushchev goes on "must be examined as part of a general disarmament problem. Including the question of prohibiting nuclear weapons. And- of liquidating the U S military bases, surrounding the Soviet Union."

makes today's Ehrushchev declaration - not at all
favorable for the top level summit meeting, which
the Soviets are demanding.

Dulles declared the American and Soviet views are so far apart, that any successful summit conference is "very doubtful." Mr. Dulles was in Manila. Speaking to a new conference, at the mit close of the meeting of the Southeast Asia treaty organization.
