Konrad Adenauer -- the man who raised West Germany almost single-handed from the ruin and degradation of World War -- dead at ninety-one.

The news--signal for nation-wide mourning throughout

West Germany. Thurch bells--sounding the death knell.

German president Heinrich Luebke--immediately ordering
a state funeral.

Soon after--condolances pouring in from all over the world. Pope Paul expressing his personal grief--DeGaulle of France offering his deepest sympathy. And here in the states--President Johnson calling Adenauer a life-long foe of tyranny; a man-said he--"who will always be a symbol of the vitality and courage of the German people."

On the one hand-the Pope denouncing extreme
