The White House - President Nixon signed into law

today - a new three-year extension of the current Highway

Act; thus providing for the allocation - of an additional

Twenty-Three Billion in Highway Trust funds; some of which

will now be used for the first time - in developing mass

transit.

At the same time z an official statement. The

President calling the new legislation - "an important

forward step for our country; not only in providing for better

and more balanced transportation - but also in related fields

such as environmental protection, highway safety, energy

conservation and community development."

Off-the-cuff - the President adding: "After the two smog alerts we've had in Washington - let's have more mass transit."

WATERGATE

Special Watergate Prosecutor Archibald Cox was back in court today Attempting to force the release of confidential White House tapes. Cox accusing the President — Long so of withholding vital criminal evidence—by his own "personal choice" rather than any legal or Constitutional mandate.

Adding that a court order to produce the tapes - would reaffirm the principle that "no man is above the law."

SEATTLE FOLLOW WATERGATE

A related item - from Seattle; where John Ehrlichman was holding his first news conference - since testifying before the Senate Watergate Committee. The former White House adviser - saying he has since received "literally thousands of letters;" the great majority - highly critical of the committee's tactics - said he.
