VIETNAM

In Vietnam -- rocket-firing American helicopters tonight attacked a force of Communist infiltrators -- within five miles of Saigon. U.S. rockets, flares and tracer bullets -- lighting up the sky in a display of fireworks -- clearly visible from rooftops in the city.

The Viet Cong were driven off -- before they could inflict any damage. The battle capping an intensified effort -- in the Saigon area, with five Viet Cong attacks yesterday -- all within twenty-five miles of the capital.



BRITISH

The British Labor Party -- meeting at Blackpool today voted its overwhelming support of U.S. policies in Vietnam, (while calling for a halt -- to American air raids on North Vietnam, but emphasizing that this can only be coupled with an end to the so-called "Military adventures" from Hanoi.)

## KASHMIR

We hear of another clash between Indian and Pakistani forces today in the Sind Desert area. India further claiming that Pakistani infiltrators -- are burning bridges and houses, as they fall back to their own lines, to the north in Kashmir.

Meanwhile, Pakistan today declared at the United Nations that it will never withdraw from Kashmir unless a U.N. Peace Force is present -- or there is some other machinery to prevent India from moving in.

CAIRO

In Cairo -- Premier Ali Sabry of Egypt -- handed in his resignation today, to clear the way for the so-called "New Revolutionary Drive" -- demanded six months ago by Nasser.

The resignation expected to herald a top-to-bottom shake-up -- in the Arab Socialist Union -- Egypt's only legal political party -- and in the government; but not in the field of foreign policy.
