The new interim peace agreement between Egypt and Israel was signed, sealed and delivered today at Geneva. The whole proceedings taking only eleven minutes - with no smiles, no hand shakes, no speeches. The two delegations - even sitting at separate tables about ten feet apart. But it is generally considered to be a major step toward lasting peace in the Middle East.

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Meanwhile, in Cairo, President Sadat was
