

GENEVA

Thurs. Sept. 4-75,

The new interim peace agreement between Egypt and Israel was signed, sealed and delivered today at Geneva. The whole proceedings taking only eleven minutes - with no smiles, no hand shakes, no speeches. The two delegations - even sitting at ~~the~~ separate tables about ten feet apart. But it is generally considered to be a major step toward lasting peace in the Middle East.

Meanwhile, in Cairo, President Sadat was ~~defending~~ defending the new pact on TV - saying in essence, that it was the best he could get in a difficult situation. And denying he had sold out his neighbors.

"I was offered a total withdrawal from the Sinai" said he- "in return for ending the state of war with Israel; but", he added, "I refused because I have commitments to Syria - and to the Palestinian cause."

Sadat also lashed out at the Kremlin for being what he termed "seditious rumor mongers." Their sole intent said Sadat was "to blow up the ~~at~~ situation - in the Middle East."

The Egyptian President went on to praise President Ford - for quote his "personal intervention" and "great effort" in bringing about the new accord. He spoke of Ford as "a man who kept his word and promises - despite difficult domestic circumstances,"

WHITE HOUSE FOLLOW CAIRO

Here at home - President Ford and Secretary of State Kissinger met today with congressional leaders - to get their cooperation. House Speaker Carl Albert later predicted congressional approval of the Near East Pact - "in two to three weeks."

The President now is off to Seattle for two days of politicking on the West Coast. From Portland - where he spends the night, he'll fly to Sacramento where tomorrow he will address a joint session of the California legislature.
