approved overwhelmingly - the government's invoking
of extraordinary ~~the~~ police powers. This - as you
know - following the murder of kidnapped ~~the~~ Labor
Minister LaPorte. Prime Minister ~~Trudeau~~ Trudeau drawing
applause loud and long from all sides - when he pledged
to stamp out the "small band of twisted men" who sought
only to provoke hate; meaning the French Liberation
Front which still holds British Diplomat James Cross.


At the same time - in Montreal - a police search
leading today to a small bungalow; the place we are told -
where LaPorte was apparently held captive ^{and} then slain.

COLUMBUS

~~Here at home again~~ - President Nixon today
launched ^{his} a two-day political swing through the mid-
lands of America. First stop - Columbus, Ohio;
where the President strongly endorsed the candidacy
of Robert ~~A.~~ Taft Jr. for U S Senator. The President
saying he needed ~~set~~ men in the Senate - who ~~would~~ will
support instead of fight his policy on Vietnam; men
who will help -- said he - "not only to end the war;
but more importantly - end it in a way to win the peace."

The President also came down hard - on the
issue of law and order. Asserting: "It's time to
~~draw~~ draw the line" on a rising tide of crime and
violence, ^{—time to} ~~say~~ say we're not going to stand for it."
The President adding that "in any society that permits
peaceful change - as ours does - there is no cause to
~~resort~~ resort to violence."



ADD COLUMBUS

In a later stop - at ~~San~~ Grand Forks, ^{North} ~~Dakota~~ Dakota
the President saying he agrees wholeheartedly - with
those who shout "end the war." But he added -
that his own newly announced plan to stop the fighting -
was clearly "the most generous proposal in international
diplomacy."

Meanwhile, first Lady Pat Nixon - was doing a little politicing of her own; ~~Today, Mrs. Nixon~~ travelling to Michigan to endorse the Senate candidacy of her long-time friend, ~~Lenore~~ Lenore Romney. The latter - apparently needing all the help she can get. A recent Michigan ~~poll~~ poll favoring the incumbent - Senator Hart - nearly ten to one.

NEW YORK FOLLOW DETROIT

Elsewhere on the political scene - a state endorsement today that could well have future ramifications on a national ~~scene~~ level. New York's Mayor Lindsay, a registered Republican - announcing his support of New York Democratic Gubernatorial Candidate, ~~the~~ Arthur Goldberg. Lindsay saying: "I am now a Republican - and I intend to remain a Republican." But he noted that Goldberg last year had "stood above party lines" -- endorsing him for Mayor. Lindsay adding: "I'm convinced by the issues in this campaign - that independence is just as important now."

All of which comes as quite a blow - to the re-election hopes of New York's Governor Rockefeller. Not entirely - unexpected though. ~~But~~ You'll recall, Rockefeller having suggested yesterday - that Lindsay

"sit this one out." Rocky observing that the mayor's endorsement of Goldberg -- if it came - would be

tantamount to a bid for the Democratic nomination

for President. ~~But~~ The Governor ^{now observing,} ~~is only commenting today~~ -

~~"no comment."~~ "It's simply 'a marriage of convenience."

MIDDLEEAS T

In the Middleeast - an apparent hardening of positions today - on both sides of the^L Suez ~~peace~~ cease fire line; as evidenced first - at Cairo; where Egypt's President Anwar Sadat was saying he would be willing to extend the present cease fire agreement - but ~~and~~ only once. Sadat adding that Egypt must take all measures - "to face a ~~dangerous~~ treacherous and despicable enemy."

This - followed by an Israeli cabinet meeting in Jerusalem - with Premier Golda Meir currently visiting in New York - Deputy Premier ~~Yigal~~ Yigal Allon presiding. The Israeli's again demanding withdrawal of Egyptian missiles - before peace talks can begin. The Israelis further pledging continued observance of the cease fire - only "on the basis of reciprocity."

VATICAN

From the Vatican in Rome - an announcement ~~today~~ that a world Synod of bishops scheduled for next year - will undertake a study of the Roman Catholic Priesthood. This said to indicate a possibility, at least - that the Vatican may consider the feasibility of accepting mature married men into the ~~priesthood~~ priesthood. Vatican sources observing, however, - there is little likelihood of the church scrapping entirely its celibacy rule.

~~But~~ Same dateline - Pope Paul addressing a conference of Italian doctors, ~~urging~~ urging the medical men to - "speak out, speak out strongly" on the drug problem; ~~For~~ do so ~~while~~ while we are still in time" - said he - "to avert the spreading of the drug phenomenon, ~~And~~ its social perversion."

BRUSSELS

Brussels, ~~next~~ - a social note. U S Ambassador to Belgium, John Eisenhower and Mrs. Eisenhower - announcing today the engagement of their daughter - eighteen year old Susan Elaine Eisenhower. Young Susan, of course - a granddaughter of the late President Eisenhower. And the lucky man - a British barrister - twenty-nine year old Alexander Hugh Bradshaw. NORTHFIELD

Here's ~~one~~ the story of a nationwide survey among high school seniors, some sixty thousand in all; the results of which ^{are} reported ~~today~~ by Merit Publishing of Northfield, Illinois.

The study indicating that contrary to public impression - only about ten percent of our young people are experimenting even with so-called "soft drugs." Indeed, the vast majority of students polled - some ninety-seven percent - flatly opposed to the use of hard drugs ~~in~~ in any way shape or form.

These same students citing ~~A~~ America's greatest achievements during the past decade - Manned flight to the Moon, passage of civil rights laws and medical advances. Reverse side - the students citing Vietnam - as our greatest disaster.
