## GOOD EVENING EVERYBODY:

The Paris Stock Exchange - the Bourse - was smashed by a time bomb today - only twelve minutes after trading ended. A plastic bomb, left in a washroom - going off with a shattering blast, tearing through walls - a foot thick; pulverizing - the corridor partitions; blowing window frames - into the street; breaking - scores of window panes. The toll - fourteen injured.

Paris police say the bomb outrage was the work of - Rightwing Algerians; French settlers, trying to stymic DeGaulle's plan - for a permanent settlement, for - an Algerian Algeria.

President Kennedy is back in the White House preparing for tomorrow's meeting with Prime Minister
Macmillan. Our chief executive, Tlying in from Palm
Beach - after ending his holiday. Plunging into
conferences - with his advisors. Keading the latest
dispatches from - Laos, Cuba, the Congo, and so on.
Not forgetting problems closer to home - like the state
of our economy.

At the same time, the Secretary of State was meeting with - the British Foreign Secretary. Dean Rusk and Lord Home, preparing the groundwork - for the meeting of their chiefs tomorrow.

America's protest to Cuba reached Havana by way of Berne, Switzerland. Taking the roundabout
route because the Swiss are representing us in Cuba now that we no longer have diplomatic relations with
Castro. Berne had to instruct it's Havana Embassy to di deliver the American note. Subject - the
schooner intercepted by a Cuban gunboat in international
waters. Washington, demanding that Castro stop
harassing our ships - on the high seas.

Meanwhile, the Cuban dictator has agreed to release an American and a Canadian - who were in a small plane forced down by fighters of the Cuban airforce. Linden Blue of Denver and Don Swenson of Canada are on their way home - after spending a month in a Cuban jail.

What about the American "position paper" - on

Cuba? The one calling on Castro - to break his ties with Communism? Give Cuba the liberties - he once promised? Hell, no one expected the Dictator - to agree to that. But it's doubtful that anyone in Wachington thought he woulds The real point is that our "position paper" is getting a favorable reception - in most of Latin America. The general feeling south of the border seems to be that our indictment states this hemisphere's case against Castro - in a very convincing way. Especially that reference to - the Cuban revolution devouring it's children. Castro, shooting or forcing into exile - the Liberals/began as his loyal supporters. They fought for the freedom he promised - only to become

disillusioned with his Communististyle police state.

Vientiane reports - the Soviet airlift, still active in Laos. Poday dropping Communist paratroopers at Vang Vieng - a key strongpoint, sixty-five miles north of the capital city. The maneuver, threatening to cut off - government troops in the area. The Reds, pushing their drive to sieze as much Laotian territory as possible - before the peace talks begin.

That incident at the Elizabethville airport could have been one of the ugliest since the Congo crisis erupted. A detachment of U N troops from Sweden were on guard at the airport - when ten thousand natives of Katanga Province attacked them. The mob, armed with machetes, iron bars, and muzzle-loading rifles - overpowered the Swedes, who refused to fire in self-defense. The Katanga followers of Premier Tshombe - cut telephone lines and smashed windows. They hauled down the U N flag, tore it to shreds - and handed the shreds around as anxenierax suvenirs.

The U N soldiers probably have been massacred - if the KK Katanga police hadn't arrived to save them. Then came word from Tshombe - that authority at the airport was to be dual. The military command - to his Katanga army. The civilian command-to the U N. That's the situation - in Elizabeth ville.

An uneasy quite, falling over the city - after a riot that stopped just short of mayhem and mass murder.

The Speaker of the House calls on the American people to stop the spread of the John Birch Society. Sam Rayburn,
speaking in McKinney, Texas - termed the controversial
organization "subversive." Mr. Sam, pointing out that Founder
Robert Welch - has been making some rather indiscriminate
charges of Communism. Aiming his charges - at key men in our
public life. Allen Dulles of the C.I.A., for example - and
the late John Foster Dulles. Former President Eisenhower?
Oh, Welch doesn't call Mr. Eisenhower a "Red" - just a dupe
of the Reds.

Today, Speaker Say Rayburn castigated the movement - as an enemy of American freedom. Adding - we all should beware of the John Birch Society.
