For Henry Kissinger in Peking - an unusually lengthy meeting today with chairman Mao. The details of their conversation not disclosed. A State Department spokesman saying homeoffice. they covered "a wide range of subjects, in a friendly atmosphere." And, "at the end of the evening - " we are told - "Chairman Mao asked Dr. Kissinger to convey his regards to President Nixon."
