GOOD EVENING EVERYBODY:

Winston Churchill, eighty-three years old, has pneumonia and pleurisy. So stated in a medical bulletin issued at his vacation home on the French Riviera.

Earlier, today, the word was that the great British statesman was ill. The character of his ailment - kept secret for hours. His physicians explaining - they wanted all members of his family to be informed first.

Lady Churchill and daughter Sarah are with Sir Winston on the Riviera. Two other daughters and his son,

Randolph - had to be informed.

Churchill's long-time physician, bord Moran, flew to the Riviera, where, today, diagnosed it as pneumonia at the base of a lung. That - and pleurisy.

"Is Sir Winston on the danger list?" asked a Newsman.

"I could not answer that," replied the physician,

and then he added, "but it doesn't mean yes." He went on to say that "Sir Winston is in good spirits; passed the day reading papers, talking to his family and dealing with correspondence."

Friends of Churchill point out that he has recovered from other serious illnesses. Having suffered a stroke in Nineteen Fifty Three, when he was nearly eighty. They staying on as Prime Minister - until Nineteen Fifty-Five.

British Prime Minister MacMillan as stated in the House of Commons, today, that he "wants" a summit conference, a top-level meeting of the heads of state. "But," he added, "I do want it to be a success." He said - a big-time parley that failed would leave a worse international situation than ever.

Hence he repeated the western contention - that there must be adequate preparation for a summit conference. Either - by a meeting of the foreign ministers, or through regular diplomatic channels. To form an agenda - investigating points of on which the heads of state might possibly agree.

The Prime Minister made these statements - as a debate on foreign affairs began in Parliament, today.

President Eisenhower asks - nearly page billion

dollars for foreign aid. The figure - sent along to Congress

in a special message. More than half of the huge sum - taking

the form of military assistance for the free countries. The

rest - economic.

President Eisenhower tells Congress - that the money for foreign aid must be put up - or this country will be left isolated. Virtually alone - in a world of Communism.

In Congress, the leaders of both parties endorse the figure, but admit - there's more congressional opposition than ever to putting up so much money for foreign aid.

Moscow today backed up Red Poland - in the plan to set up a zone without nuclear weapons in Em Central Europe.

With a ban - on missiles and atomic armament. The Soviets announcing - that they mix will withdraw their ultra-modern weapons from Poland and East Germany, if the West accepts the scheme. Moscow - taking action to keep the Polish plan in the forefront of the news.

# KOREA WITHDRAWAL

The Chinese Reds challenge the United States - to atch a withdrawal of troops from Korea. The government of Mao Tse-Tung - to take Chinese forces out of Communist North Kobea. The Reds - now calling on the United States to do likewise.

of course, the Chinese Communists are on the border of Korea - while we would have to take our soldiers overseas.

Which would make it unequal deal.

In any case, the G I's are in free Korea - at the request of the United Nations. So the government in Washington will probably consult with the U N - before making any reply to Red China.

## ADD KOREA - WITHDRAWAL

A later dispatch from Washington tells us - the State Department will not consider any withdrawal of American forces from South Korea. A spokesman pointing out - that the next move of the Reds should be to make an agreement for free elections, which would unify all Korea.

### KOREA PLANE

The U N command in Korea, today, issued a denunciation of the refusal of the North Korean Communists - to return an airliner. Which was hi-jacked - and forced at to land at a Red airport. American Major General Kyster Declaring - that thirty-four passengers in were being held as hostages. General Kyster - Chief negotiator for the U N - demanding that the plane be handed back.

The North Korean contention is that the incident
is not a proper subject - for the military armistice commission.
But - should be settled by negotiations with the South Korean
government. \*\* Pree Korea, however, does not recognize the
Red regime in the North - and won't negotiate with it.

France plans - a neutral zone all along the Algerian
Tunisian frontier. A strip of "no man's land." The purpose to prevent new border incidents. Sealing off - the entire
length to keep rebel bands from crossing into Algeria.

The plan was announced in Paris was yesterday at a meeting of Premier Gaillard's cabinet. With a statement - that all inhabitants would be evacuated from the buffer zone.

And a continuous mine field - laid along the strip of "no man's land."

At the same time the French announce - they will not, under any circumstances, abandon their naval has base at Bizerte, on the coast of Tunisia. The Tunisian government demands an evacuation - but the French have said no.

Another new argument - in the troubled field of international relations. Between Egypt and Sudan - this time. The Sudanese charge that Egypt is massing as troops in two areas along the Egypt-Sudan border. Areas in dispute; both countries claiming them,— including Wadi Halfa and the 2nd cataract of the Mile.

Today the government at Khartum stated - that

Sudanese troops have moved into position to check possible

Egyptian aggression.

Over in Italy, they've discovered the wreck - of the U S Air Force transport plane. Hissing, with sixteen aboard - since last Saturday.

The C-Forty-Seven had left Naples, on its way to

Athens - and there was a four-day search through the mountains

of southern Italy. But, is the plane had crashed - just

outside Naples. The wreckage - found lying on the slopes of

Mt. Vesuvius.

That most famous of all volcanos - easily visible

from Maples. But in low-hanging clouds and a heavy fog hid

the wreck until today. No sign of life reported at the

scene - on the slopes of Vesuvius, which has so long a history

of disaster.

#### SHIPWRECK

On the stormy sea off Norfolk, Virginia, a ship sank today. The Italian ore vessel, Bonitas - going to the bottom a few hours after the tragedy to its crew.

The tragedy - all the bitterer because of prompt rescue operations. The vessel - springing a leak in a wintry tempest. The crew - taking to a life boat. A U.S. Coast Guard plane - flying over and circling the stricken ship.

The American liner President Adams - hurrying to the scene and arriving in plenty of time. The life boat - pulling to the side of the liner. When a huge wave overturned it - throwing the occupants into the icy water, where they were swept away.

Twenty-seven missing - all, apparently, lost. Three rescued - in a dangerous lifesaving operation.

#### INVESTIGATION TELEVISION

The congressional investigation into the Miami television affair - takes a new turn. With a disclosure - that one of the applicants for the T V channel tried to gain the help of Vice President Nixon. Colonel Frank Katzentine - whose application was unsuccessful.

Previously, we heard the charge, and made by Katzentine that National Airlines had been awarded the channel - with the aid of political influence. Mrs. Eisenhower's brother in law Colonel George Gordon Moore- mentioned.

So today, the sub-committee produced a letter from Katsentine's files. Indicating - that he tried to get the health help of the Vice President. No indication - of whether or not the appeal ever came to Nixon's attention.
