If there remained any doubt about the capabilities of properly-trained South Vietnamese fighting men - it should have been dispelled once and for all today; on a battlefield - near Phuoc Qua; where some two hundred South Vietnamese troops and their four American advisers - successfully hurled back three suicidal attacks; beating off a force of about twelve hundred - North Vietnamese Regulars.

When the last shot was fired - the battle over - the field of combat lay littered with two hundred enemy dead. The South Vietnamese losing five men - the Americans none. Prompting a flying visit from Lieutenant General Frederick Weyand - to give the victors his personal congratulations.

The General noting what's more that this apparently was "the first major combat" for the enemy infiltrators.

And it must have been - "as demoralizing as hell" - said

POTOMAC

The war in Vietnam - also much on the mind of President Johnson today; at the dedication of a memorial to President Theodore Roosevelt - on an island in the Potomac River.

During a brief speech - the President remarking
