

DISARMAMENT

L.T. - (Eds. Mon. Mar, 28 - 60,

Tonight, President Eisenhower and British Prime Minister MacMillan are at the presidential retreat in Maryland - Camp David, discussing - the question of a reply to the Soviet proposal for a ban on atomic testing.

In Geneva, today, the West presented a proposal for an international disarmament organization, to supervise - future tasks in a reduction of guns and bombs.

The western suggestion - named task number one, the supervision - of a proposed ban on the use of outer space for military purposes.

The Khrushchev tour in France produced a blaze of agitation today. In the city of Dijon, famous - for mustard. Dijon mustard - of international renown. The Soviet Premier - visiting the city which ~~is~~ brought about - a paradoxical situation.

The Mayor of Dijon, who would normally greet him, is - a Roman Catholic Priest. Eighty-four year old Felix Kir - whose ecclesiastical rank is that of Canon. Welcoming Khrushchev, Canon Kir would wear - his churchly robes. Which would have made - a strange spectacle. A priest of Rome, in ecclesiastical dress - exchanging compliments with the big boss of Communism.

Yesterday, Canon Kir received a message from his Bishop, instructing him - that he was not to preside at the reception for Khrushchev. The Canon - in the middle. Between his post, as Mayor and his religious rank.

The Bishop's decision - based on word from the Vatican. Which had ordered - that no Catholic priest was

to participate in the festivities for Khrushchev. This, as a protest - against the oppression of the churches behind the Iron Curtain.

Canon Kir objected. He favors a more flexible attitude ~~xxx~~ toward Communism. He said, he'd obey his Bishop. But added - if Khrushchev visited him at his home he would receive him.

All of which produced no end of argument - in Dijon. Many - criticizing the order from the Bishop. So there was a fear - of clashes. The more so - because it was thought quite possible that Nikita might call on Canon Kir, Taking him at his word - about being willing to receive him.

So shortly before Khrushchev arrived in Dijon today - the authorities removed the mayor churchman from his home. Canon Kir - displeased, where they took him off to some unknown destination.



Naturally, when Khrushchev arrived, and heard of all this, he took advantage of the occasion - to get in a few digs. Stating solemnly:

"Canon Kir is absent from us, physically - but he is here, spiritually, with us." Nikita - quite spiritual about it.

So that's the news from Dijon, the city of mustard - after Khrushchev had ~~got~~ a wild welcome in Marseilles, <sup>a seaport</sup> ~~which is~~ full of Communists, <sup>where</sup> ~~and~~ they whooped it up.

VATICAN

At the Vatican - a secret. Which certainly will have a lot of people - guessing. Today Pope John the Twenty Third named - three more Cardinals. Who are they? That's the secret.

The papal consistory - formally elevating the seven new Cardinals named by the ~~Ri~~ Pontiff some weeks ago. The seven  $\Leftarrow$  that included two prelates from Asia and a Negro, from Africa. Which, in itself would have made a headline today. The consecration of Cardinal Rugambwa of Rutabo, in Tanganyika.

But Pope John took the occasion to announce the nomination of another three - their identities not revealed. To be made public - in a future consistory. The guessing is - that they may be prelates behind the Iron Curtain.

The secret three now raises the number of Cardinals - to eighty-eight. The largest in history.

SOUTH AFRICA

South Africa - virtually tied up, today, ~~By~~ a stay home strike - of negro workers.

Everywhere, native Africans were called upon - to observe a day of mourning ~~for~~ the seventy-two victims - in the shooting a week ago.

Heavy forces of ~~pi~~ police - on the alert. With little or no disturbance in most places. But - violent rioting in a native township near Johannesburg, ~~where~~ negro mobs went on the rampage, ~~Burning~~ beer halls - and surrounding a police station.

ARGENTINA

Terrorism - in Buenos Aires, today; Following -  
a weekend election, Revealing a sharp decline - in the  
popularity of President Frondizi's government. His margin  
in the Argentine Congress - reduced. Although he still  
retains a majority.

Today, anti-Frondizi crowds poured into the  
streets; Battling the police. And terrorist explosions -  
blew up two power stations in Buenos Aires.



COURT

Today, the Supreme Court upheld the espionage conviction of Colonel Rudolf Ivanovich Abel, who ~~xx~~ was given a thirty year sentence - as a Soviet spy. He appealed ~~xx~~ on the ground that evidence against him had been obtained -- illegally. Appeal - rejected.

The high tribunal also ruled - against Matthew Connolly and Lamar Caudle, former officials of the Truman administration, ~~Convicted~~ - of conspiring to evade income tax. They'll now have to begin serving <sup>those jail</sup> ~~xxx~~ ~~xxx~~ sentences -- of two years each.



GOLD FINE

In Boston, the beginning of the trial - of Bernard Goldfine, The gift giving textile tycoon <sup>and one time friend</sup> ~~and~~ of Sherman Adams, former Presidential aide. Goldfine - charged with income tax evasion to the tune of nearly eight hundred thousand dollars. His secretary, Mildred Paperman - a fellow defendant. Charged with personal tax dodging - and complicity in the evasion of <sup>his</sup> corporation taxes.

In the Boston court, both pleaded innocent - and were released on bail.

## RACKETS

The Senate rackets committee, today, gave a report on Joey Glimco - head of the Chicago taxi drivers union. Stating - that Glimco appropriated fifty thousand dollars of union money. Forty thousand of which - he used in the building of a home for ~~in~~ himself and his secretary, Miss LaVerne Murray. ~~A love nest - according to Senate investigators.~~

But this romantic allegation is eclipsed - by what the committee has to say about John O'Brien, second Vice President of the Teamsters Union. Charging - that O'Brien and two other teamster officials looted the treasury of the local union in Chicago, To the tune - of one-million, one-hundred-and-thirty-six thousand,-two-hundred-and-seventy-five dollars.

The investigators also took a swipe at somebody else. Guess who? James Hoffa, President of the Teamsters Union. Charged - with having underworld connections.

The report from the committee stated that racketeers and gangsters are getting an increasing hold on American economy. The Democrats on the committee urge the creation of a national crime commission - to combat the menace of the underworld. But the Republican minority thinks - that would be an unnecessary expense.
