At Camp David, Maryland - a final preface today to that "new chapter" in U.S. and Chinese relations.

President Nixon completed his background studies - in preparation for his departure tomorrow morning for Peking.

The big send-off - set for Ten O'clock, Washington-time.

Republicans and Democrats alike - wishing the

President all success. Senate Majority Leader Mike

Mansfield, for one - saying the President's trip could

mark the beginning of a new era of peaceful evolution.

Senate Minority Leader Hugh Scott - adding that this could

be "an earth-shaking event."

The Democratic National Committee goes further suggesting tonight - that "something big is in the works" in Peking; possibly - the committee says an immediate end to the fighting in Vietnam; in which case - the "Democrats say they would be found the front ranks of those cheering."

Reverse side - from Admiral Thomas Moorer,

chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff; in a report today - on

U.S. military preparedness. Admiral Moorer contends the

U.S. must be ready to fight nuclear wars - with Russia

and Red China, both at the same time. He explained that

"nuclear war with only one of these nations" - would

necessitate "sufficient strategic forces to deter
simultaneously - a nuclear attack from the other."

Admiral Moorer added that "the relative military power of the United States - has clearly peaked and is now declining;" which means - that "henceforth, we will have to plot our course with much greater precision - and calculate our risks much more closely."

On the campaign trail - Senator McGovern

carried his White House aspirations to Boston today; there

suggesting that it might be best to legalize marijuana
along with controls such as those now imposed on alcohol.

But he also suggested - with regard to marijuana
"continuing and expanding educational programs aimed at

discouraging its use."

were set off today - outside the city's police and fire

department headquarters. This in protest - apparently
against the re-election campaign of President Nixon.

In any event, police later seized as suspects - a young man and a young woman; both - described as "student radicals." A leaflet found in their possession - said "The pig media has been trying to portray the coming election as a quiet affair - we have shown them what to expect."

That power crisis in Britain - caused by a nationwide coal strike - worse than ever today. British industry nearing a total shutdown - that threatens to idle, in all, more than twenty million.
