Meanwhile，the Boeing 魰玉 landed－with no one
aboard realizing how close they had been to disaster．

That collision in the Pacific, off the California coast - was a case of pigmy agatnst the giant. The pigmy, the destroyer "Edwards" - weighing less than three thousand tons. The giant, ${ }^{\prime}$ the aircraft carrier "Bennington" fortythousand tons.
The two ships - maneuvering into position during
a refueling operation. Something going wrong. Somebody giving - the wrong order. The "Edwards" slamming into the "Bennington". The aircraft - slightly damaged. The destroyer - battered by the impact. Almost losing - its superstructure. Tonight, limping back - to Long Beach, for ramet repairs. The carrier - sailing on, as if nothing had happened.

Those casualties at Ilford, England - were caused
by panic. A subway train, catching fire in a tunnel - during
the rush hour. Someone shouting - "fire" A woman -screaming.

Men - battering at the doors. A stampede - through the cars.

Five hundred passengers - fighting to get out.
Fifty - injured, the blaze - minor.

In Levine, Texas, a house is in ruins tonight -
all because a dog crawled under it. The House, belonging to Mrs. Egbert Hardcastle - who tried to shoo a stray pooch out of her yard. Instead, it scooted past her under the house. Refusing - to come out.

Mrs. Hardcastle, calling the city officials - who sent water superintendent, Kurt Sollock. The xixirininnet
ordering his men to drive the dog out - by spraying under the house. The spray - a mixture of insecticide and diesel oil.

The spray didn't move the dog; but it did move the house; and superintendent Sollock - and his three men. Causing an explosion that blew the building part. And hurling the superintendent into the street, with his assistants - piled on top of him. Bystanders, including Mrs. Mardcastle - knocked down by the blast. No one seriously injured. Even the dog, surviving - howling dismally in the midst of the debris.
