## GOOD EVENING EVERYBODY:

The American government contradicts Ahrushchev on the subject of U-2 flights. Last night, the boss of
the Kremlin said on a TV show - that we had planned
another over-flight of the Soviet Union during his visit
to New York, that the Bussians, learning of the operation
- warned Washington to call it off. And, it was called
off - said Khrushchev.

The word from the State Department today is that this assertion is completely false. Francis Tully, spokesman for The State Dept. says that we haven't planned any more U-2 flights since President Bisenhower's Paris declaration when the President informed Khrushchev that the flights had been called off, and, that we've stuck to the policy. That, Khrushchev is just confused, mixing up different plane flights; - says the State Department.

The TV program, by the way has lost a sponsor. The

Sutro Brothers, pulling out of David Susskind's "Open End" because their position on Khrushchev was not stated before
the program. The xxx sponsor had refused to pay for
Kohrushchev's appearance - on the ground that he would only
be offered a propaganda platform.

Meanwhile, letters and telegrams are man pouring angry what the interview. The Critics claim that Khrushchev was allowed to evade the questions - and make speeches on the virtues of Communism, and the inequities of the free world.

opponent a recent convert to the cause of saving and

## KENNEDY FOLLOW NIXON

Senator Kennedy, today, was in the South. And he said he will discuss the civil issue in Dixie.
