GOOD EVENING EVERYBODY:

The American government contradicts Khrushchev - on the subject of U-2 flights. Last night, the boss of the Kremlin said on a TV show - that we had planned another over-flight of the Soviet Union during his visit to New York, that the Russians, learning of the operation - warned Washington to call it off. And, it was called off - said Khrushchev.

The word from the State Department today is that this assertion is completely false. Francis Tully, spokesman for The State Dept. says that we haven't planned any more U-2 flights since President Eisenhower's Paris declaration when the President informed Khrushchev that the flights had been called off, and, that we've stuck to the policy. That, Khrushchev is just confused, mixing up different plane flights; - says the State Department.

and the inequities of the free world.

Nixon

Touring the Rocky Mountains today - Vice President Nixon accused Senator Kennedy of "glaring misrepresentation." Subject - America's economic strength in relation to Russia's. Nixon, in Denver, Charged Kennedy with saying that the Russians will be producing more power than we do - within fifteen years. To Nixon this is - a "glaring misrepresentation"

~~Turning~~ Turning to reclamation - Nixon termed Kennedy "a johnny-come lately". According to Nixon, the Eisenhower administration has undertaken more reclamation - than the Truman administration did. ^{that} ~~with~~ his Democratic ^{is} opponent ~~is~~ a recent convert to the cause of saving and using our national resources.

KENNEDY FOLLOW NIXON

Senator Kennedy, today, was in the South. And he said he will discuss the civil issue in Dixie.

He claims that Nixon is the one who speaks differently about civil rights - on opposite sides of the Mason-Dixon line.

Kennedy made a special stop - at Warm Springs, Georgia, where Franklin D. Roosevelt used to go for treatment - and where he died. Kennedy, who often refers to F;D.R. - received an enthusiastic welcome from a big crowd at the "Little White House" in Warm Springs.
