And then, finally - the moment of truth. By a vote of fifty one to forty nine the Senate rejecting a key amendment. One that would have barred deployment of an ABM system for another year - while permitting only research and development. Making final passage - apparently a mere formality. In short, the ABM -

a-okay all the way. For the Nixon administration - a tremendous victory.
