MOSCOW

At the Moscow summit - on the eve of the President's return to the US - an exchange of toasts tonight at a state dinner.

President Nixon first - with remarks similar to those he made earlier on Russian TV. The President saying: "Our goal cannot be accomplished in one meeting - or two or even three; but by continuing our meetings we will make permanent progress - toward our goal of a permanent peace."

If the President was somewhat cautious though -Soviet leader Leonid Brezhnev was exactly the opposite. In his answering toast saying the results of the latest Moscow summit - "can already be described as constructive and weighty." By the way of proof - disclosing that he and the President- will soon sign a series of arms limitations agreements. "This complex of agreements - could perhaps have been still broader" - said he; "but what was agreed to

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this time" he added - "tangibly strengthens the cause of

peace throughout the world."

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And now this message.

Moscow again - an announcement today that President Nixon's left leg - is still slightly swollen. Spokesman Ron Ziegler insisting, however, that the **president's** phlebitis has now "resolved itself." Fiegter also saying the President was somewhat piqued - at news reports that he was "dragging" his leg at the end of a long day yesterday in Minsk. The President telling Ziegler to "ask the press how they would got feel to they were riding in a car for six hours." Adding if unything of all , he was merely mitte a little stiff.

At Caracas - another session in the continuing U N conference - on the laws of the sea. Red China charging today that the U S and the Soviet Union - are attempting to monopolize the seas. Peking adding that Russia "is shameless τ and to boast fabout fulfilling the wild Czarist ambitions of a century ago - to dominate the sea." The body of Argentina's Juan Peron lay in state today - in the Argentinian National Assembly. Tens of thousands of mourners - filing by the open casket - many kissing the fallen leader of patting him on the head as they passed by - while Peron's the ex-calculation, widow - Maria Estela, who is now the President of Argentina - maintaining a silent vigil at the side of the coffin.

STATE

The US today accused Turkey of a breach of faith in revoking a previous ban on the cultivation of opium poppies. State Department spokesman John King - noting the US had paid more than thirty-seven million to obtain such a ban. Adding that the matter is still a subject of "intensive discussion- between our two countries." California financier C Arnholt Smith, age
