Rome - At the Vatican ~~in Rome~~ - a report today that Pope Paul will issue new regulations next week, on the subject of - mixed marriage.

The new rules said to be in response to a request from the Ecumenical Council - for reforms in church law, as it relates to marriages - between Catholics and non-Catholics; Reforms more in ~~the~~ keeping - with hope of a new era in Christian unity.

Vatican sources indicate, however, that the Pope's message - will contain but one major change; To the effect that promises by the non-catholic partner - to respect the Catholic faith and to bring up any children as Catholics - may be made orally rather than in writing.

BAGHDAD

From Baghdad, Iraq -- news ~~today~~ of an attempted coup. General Razzak - who became Premier only last week - said to have tried to take over from President Aref, while the latter was out of the country - at that continuing Arab summit meeting in Casablanca.

The plot said to have been thwarted, however, by General Aref, <sup>brother of the President and</sup> Acting Chief of Staff of the ~~Iraqi~~ army. ~~xxxx - and a brother of the absent president~~ Who personally led a tank charge - to cut off the Tazzak forces. General Razzak -- a Nasser-man - <sup>we hear has now fled from Baghdad</sup> ~~has since fled~~ to Cairo.

SHASTRI

An apparent attempt today by Prime Minister Shastri of India - to forestall a threatened invasion by Red China. Shastri accepting Peking's invitation - for a joint investigation of Indian border positions - claimed by the Chinese.

Shastri, nevertheless, in a fighting mood - in a later address to the Indian parliament at New Delhi ~~said~~:-  
"we hope ~~said he~~ that China will not take advantage of our present conflict with Pakistan." <sup>Then</sup> ~~But~~ he added <sup>But</sup> ~~that~~ "if we are attacked - we will fight for our territorial integrity."

THANT FOLLOW SHASTRI

Back at the United Nations -- Secretary General U Thant today proposed a five-point peace plan, based on withdrawal by both sides -- and talks between the two heads of government, to end the fighting between India and Pakistan.

If they reject the plan -- said Thant -- then the U.N. itself should "order" a cease-fire in the fighting zone, and take whatever steps necessary -- to assist in enforcing such an order -- as was done in Palestine and Korea.

No direct mention in U Thant's remarks -- of China's three day ultimatum to India. But he did urge speedy consideration -- of his proposals; because -- as he put it -- "a real danger to world peace -- is now imminent."



## VIETNAM

In Vietnam -- American and South Vietnamese forces -- took a mounting toll today; in a series of scattered engagements -- north of Saigon. All told -- forty five communists killed -- eighty-six captured.

On the other side of Saigon -- another hit and run attack with some forty Viet Cong attempting to storm a government outpost -- only seven miles from the city, were chased by American fighter planes.

RISNER

One of America's top airmen of the Vietnamese war -- was listed today as missing, in action. No further details.

Lieutenant Colonel Robinson Risner -- winner of the Air Force Cross -- the nation's second highest military decoration.

He was featured in a recent cover story, in Time -- for his daring exploits in Viet Nam.
