Barring the unpredictable - a world summit meeting at the United Nations - now seen as a virtual certainty. With Soviet Premier Kosygin today announcing plans to head the Soviet delegation - to that expected emergency session of the UN General Assembly. Also inviting all chana other world leaders - to join in the crisis meeting on the Middle East.

This drawing an immediate response from Washington that President Johnson will be "happy" to meet with Kosygin or any other foreign dignitaries coming to the U.N. Making the meeting a virtual command performance - for every President, Premier and potentate in the world.

Ironically, the United States today became
the first of the world's great powers to vote "no" on the
Soviet request for the emergency session. However,
support slowly piling up - among other member-nations.

Kosygin himself, set to fly to New York tomorrow, and planning to confer with DeGaulle of France at a brief stop of over in Paris. All this ensuring the hottest time on the banks of the East River - since Khrushchev's shoe-thumping escapade a few years back.

In the meantime - Israel taking advantage of the brief interval. Proceeding with first formal steps - to annex the old city of Jerusalem? captured only last week - from Jordanian forces. The Israelis thus serving notice they intend to keep the sacred soil - come what may at the U.N.

An ominous note added to the mid-east crisis - with a report today from London. British Defense experts warning that failure to achieve a lasting peace - will lead almost certainly to an Israeli clamor for nuclear weapons.

Full details of Israeli accomplishments in the field of nuclear physics - still a closely-guarded secret.

The British asserting though - that Israeli scientists have clearly mastered the know-how of nuclear weaponry; and, therefore, could probably master the technology of the atomic bomb -- in a comparatively short time.

What's needed - we're told - a clear-cut agreement among the major powers - banning nuclear arms from the Middle East. The moreso - say the British - because if Israel were permitted to build nuclear weapons - others with similar nuclear know-how would soon be right behind.

Among them - India, Sweden and West Germany.

Meanwhile, repercussions from the lightning war - were still reverberating today through the Arab world.

At Amman in Jordan - King Hussein ordering a major shake-up in his royal cabinet. Among the banished - Hussein's cousin Sharif Abdel Hamid Sharf; along with Wasfi Tell - ex-chief of the cabinet. Both men - staunch anti-Nasserites.

Taking over as new head of the cabinet 
Hussein's uncle, Sherif Hussein Ben Nasser. No relation 
to Egypt's Nasser. But a man who has long favoreg ties 
with the rest of the Arab world.

At the same time - a report today from the Kuwait embassy in Cairo, Saying that all Arab nations have agreed to send delegates - to a Foreign Ministers meeting Saturday in Kuwait. Purpose: To hold a post-mortem on the brief war - to see if anything can be salvaged from the ashes of defeat.

A related item -- from Rabat in Morocco,

To the effect that the Arab Foreign Ministers - may

later travel to New York in a body; to present their views

personally - enmasse - to the UN.

They'll do it, that is - if they can formulate one common policy. Which may take - some doing.

Then there's a story today - from Moscow. See Soviet Premier Kosygin quoted as saying - it would have been impossible for Israel to win the war in the Middle East - without U S aid.

This supposedly at a reception - for visiting Japanese diplomats. If true - the closest the Kremlin has yet come - to blaming the United States for that Arab defeat.

However, Kosygin's remarks - unreported in the Soviet Press. Which has also steadfastly refused to print Arab charges - that U S and British aircraft joined in the Israeli attack. Leading observers to believe that Kosygin's statement - may have been made solely to smoothe the Arab world.

DeGaulle of France - another going out of his way today - to placate the Arab world. Announcing flatly in Paris - that France will not recognize any Israeli annexation of Arab territories.

If there is to be any change in the status quo said DeGaulle - it must be freely negotiated by the two
sides; with final approval from, quote, "the international
community" - meaning the major world powers.

DeGaulle's statement also blaming Israel for unleashing military action against the Arab states.

However, state stopping just short - of outright condemnation of Israel.

DeGaulle - as you know - the choice of certain

Arab states - to serve as mediator in mid-east.

men.

A brief lull in ground fighting in Vietnam shattered suddenly today, With American and South
Vietnamese troops striking in force - against a long
time enemy sanctuary just north of Saigon.

America's "big red one" - the first division spear-heading the attack. US infantrymen moving ahead
so fast - they were sometimes forced to dodge their
own firepower.

The drive - aimed at trapping three battalions

of Viet Cong! believed to be using the sanctuary as a

base for terrorist operations against the capital area.

First reports indicating a toll of some sixty enemy dead
for a ratio of nearly ten to one over American losses.

To the south - news today of an allied amphibious attack - in the Mekong delta. Iron-clad U S gunboats - bottling up a force of Viet Cong in a murky swamp; with South Vietnamese rangers and infantrymen - leaping to the attack. Enemy losses - set at more than two hundred

On the political front - back in Saigon Premier Ky again called today for more American troops
in Vietnam. Saying it will take at least another hundred
and forty thousand men - to finish the job of defeating
the Viet Cong. This in addition to nearly half a million
US troops - currently stationed in Vietnam:

At the same time - Ky filing formally as a candidate for President! Promising to resign his command of the South Vietnamese air force - also his xxxx rank of Air Marshall, between now and election-time -- September Third.

Senator Stennis of Mississippi - chairman of the Senate Ethics Committee -- cast once more today in the role of chief prosecutor. Citing chapter and verse - in the tangled financial affairs of Senator Thomas Dodx de Dodd of Connecticut.

Stennis finally coming to the conclusion - that

The come Senator Dodd's turn again he fairly shouted his denial of the accusation. "What did I get out of it?" he cried. Then - answering his own question: "I got fifty thousand in the hole - that's what I got out of it", -

The outlook has now - for a vote probably the first of next week.
