WASHINGTON-ARABS

In Washington, the Arabian visits continue.

President Eisenhower, today, conferring with Dr. Charles

Malik, Foreign Minister of Lebanon. Malik - pro-western

a supporter of the Eisenhower Doctrine.

Yesterday, the President had talks with Crown Prince Abdul Illah of Iraq - and, today, Abdul Illah met King Saud, who is still in Washington. The first meeting of the Crown Prince of Iraq and the Monarch of Saudi Arabia - since the nineteen-twenties.

King Saud told a news conference today - that the Eisenhower program for the Middle East is "good".

Promising - that he will make matters clearer with

Arab leaders, on his return home.

Britain and the United States - will pool their guided missile research. Just as they cooperated in the development of the Atom Bomb - during World War Two.

So stated in the House of Commons, today - by
Minister of Defense Duncan Sandys. Who has just
returned from Washington - where he negotiated with top
American Defense Officials.

He came to the United States - to explain the British military cut-back. The necessity - of reducing armament expenditures, because of the financial crisis following the Suez affair. One way of spending less because on money - getting those ultra-modern weapons.

Duncan Sandys told the House of Commonda today, that an arrangement was worked out - for British-American collaboration in the field of missiles. Britain to get some American weapons - guided missiles of intermediate range, we hear. British science - to join with American science - in perfecting the Intercontinental Ballistics Missile. Called the "ultimate weapon."

Reports in London are that the over-all plan is to turn Britain into a giant rocket base. British
strategy of defense - to change over from squadrons
of war planes to swarms of missles. A revolutionary
change of strategic ideas - in this atomic age.

All of which will go into final discussion, when Prime Minister MacMillan meets President Eisenhower.

The word being that MacMillan will be in Washington, sometime next month.

The new Russian budget - may reduce military expenditures a little bit. But the Soviets are putting a larger percentage into armament - than is the case in our American budget. Sixteen per cent of all the money spent by the Moscow Government - Emmercent for military purposes. Over here - ten per cent. Moreover, the Russian percentage does not include money spent for guided missiles, rockets, and atomic weapons. While such ultra-modern devices are included - in the American ten per cent.

These angles are pointed out by experts in Washington, who are studying the new Soviet budget.

They warn us - it's hard to make any real comparison.

Totalitarian bookkeeping - so different from our own.

In Moscow, a spectacular news conference - with klieg lights and all. A spokesman for the Soviet Foreign Ministry declaring - that the United States is waging a "secret war" against Communism.

He charged - that this country has been sending "spies and saboteurs" into Russia. And introduced - four Russians, whom he identified as American trained spies.

They told the correspondents - they had been recruited and trained by U.S. intelligence agents in West Germany. Then - sent into Russia, for subversion.

The Foreign Ministry press chief added that the United States carries on the "secret war", acting through, what he called, "all sorts of private committees, foundations and unions." He cited the Rockefeller Foundation, the Ford Foundation, Radio Free Europe, and so on. Which do, in fact, present the cause of Liberty.

HUNGARY

A Communist Repatriation Committee - at a camp of Hungarian refugees, near Vienna. The Reds - wanting to talk the refugees into coming back. But they never did get a chance to talk. Instead - they were met by a shower of stones from the refugees. A crowd of these yelling slogans of anti-Communism. And hurling such a bombardment of missiles - the automobile with the delegation of Communists simply turned around and left.

In Germany, an agreement - for compensation to be paid to Jewish forced-laborers in world war two.

Three thousand of them - to get as much as eleven hundred and ninety dollars each.

During the Hitler Terror, thousands of Jews were thrown into the Auschlwitz Concentration Camp.

Nearby - a plant of the giant I G Farben Chemical

Combine. Inmates of the camp - sent over to the chemical plant, as forced labor.

Today, the I G Farben Combine is being dissolved - with a settlement of claims made by a Jewish Conference. A total of six million, four hundred and thirty thousand dollars - assigned as compensation for the former forced laborers.

NATIONAL GUARD

In the National Guard controversy, the President comes out in favor of the Army plan to give National Guard recruits six months of continuous basic training. General Ike said he was speaking as a "military commander", in advocating six continuous months.

The House of Representatives, today, passed the "Baby Soil Bank" bill. Drafted by the Democrats - to aid the drought stricken ranchers of the West.

Secretary of Agriculture Ezra Benson argued against it - but his objections were not pressed by the Republican Leaders. The "Baby Soil Bank" passing by two-hundred-and-seventy to one-hundred-and-eight.

EISENHOW TR-INFLATION

President Eisenhower gave warning, today - that unless business and Labor collaborate in checking inflation, the Federal Government will have to do something about it. He urged both sides to act voluntarily - and hold the "wage-price line." That is, avoid undue increases of wages and prices. Those increases - which are causing inflation.

The President noted that such economic control by the Government - is not the American way.

But there may have to be controls, if prices and wages keep going - up and up.

Today's news dispatch from the White House tells of a remark made by President Eisenhower - and, in the dispatch describing the way he spoke, uses these words: "Calmly, and with no show of emotion."
