Good Evening Everybody:

There isn't even a trend, yet in the exciting elections north of the border today. All day millions of Canadians have been casting their votes, at polling stations all the way from Goose Bay Labrador to Vancouver Island, from Halifax to the Yukon, six time zones - in the great nation of Canada, which geographically is larger than all 50 of our states.

Some Canadian experts believe that the two major parties will be so nearly balanced that to splinter parties - minorities - will go decisive power in the Ottawa Parliament, no matter who becomes Prime Minister. One of these is the Social Credit Party - based in Quebec, the so called - "funhy money men".

But tonite no one knows who is the winner in one of the most exciting Canadian elections of our time.

The crisis in Laos may reflect the crisis - in the Communist bloc. Red China, trying to oust the Soviet Union - from leadership in Asia. Fomenting the Laotian fighting - in spite of Moscow. Putting Khrushchev on the spot - for real. Because Russia and Britain are co-chairmen of the international group - whose business it is to supervise the peace in Laos.

In any case, our government is taking - a serious view of the crisis. The State Department charging - that the Laotian Reds began the battle, And the taken are being reinforced by guerrillas - from Red North Viet Nam. We re asking the Russians and the British - to do something who it - in a hurry.

The Reason for haste? - is that The Lactian insurgents have driven the loyalist army from its headquarters, And appear to be launching a massive drive - for control of central Laos. The most severe fighting, tonight - on the Plain of Jars.

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Secretary of State Dean Rusk considers
this Communist threat a major threat to peace. Rusk
warning members of the South East Asia Treaty
Organization, meeting in Paris today, that America has
a "vital interest" in keeping South Viet Nam independent.
Britain and France, in complete agreement on this, are
backing us to the hilt.

DE_GAULLE

Signs of a thaw today in the somewhat chilly atmosphere between France and America. That coldness has been due to differences of opinion on nuclear armament, and on Britain's entry into the Common Market.

President De Gaulle meeting with Secretary
of State Dean Rusk this afternoon for discussions
which experts think may help straighten things out.
His Foreign Secretary, Couve de Murville, also inviting
British Foreign Secretary Lord Home to talk things
over. The French saying De Gaulle is putting on a
"charm campaign" - during the Rusk visit, because he
wants to show his partners - especially America - that
he is a member in good standing of the Western Alliance,
in spite of all differences.

MCNAMARA

Defense Secretary McNamara was most
emphatic today in telling Congress to cut the Defense
Budget - rather than tamper with our programs for
helping promote - "politically stable governments",
south of the border and elsewhere.

Secretary McNamara saying flatly that such programs are - "absolutely essential for our national security".

This confirms what he has said before, that he would rather see a billion dollar cut in the Defense budget.

For instance, Secretary McNamara thinks the unrest in Venezuela and Guatemala - even though the democratic governments have won out in those two nations - is far more dangerous than Communism in Cuba.

POLARIS

The Navy is satisfied tonight - with its

launching of an advanced version of the newest A-3

Polaris missile. Calling the shot a "significant success." The thirty-foot rocket fired today - from a land-based pad - some two thousand miles across. the Atlantic Ocean. Arriving at its target area in less than twenty minutes. The A-3 - to be the mightiest rocket ever designed for firing from submerged nuclear submarines.

GOLDWATER

In case you have had any doubts about the matter - some A mericans are determined to put the Senior Senator from Arizona in the White House. A movement to draft Senator Barry Goldwater - has just been launched in Washington.

CLEVELAND
