WHITE HOUSE

From the White House - a special message today; spelling out in greater detail - the President's new schools plan.

As he promised last night - the President urges Congress to ban any new forced busing programs. He also called for passage - of a new equal educational opportunities act; to ensure that every student have an equal chance at education - regardless of race or color. In the same vein, the President urging an appropriation of two and a half billion - to improve the quality of poverty area schools.

The President also siting new achievements in the field of race relations; proving - said he that "This administration means what it says - about dismantling racial barriers - about opening up jobs, housing, schools, and opportunity to all Americans." The President adding "These efforts will all go forward - with vigor and

conviction;" for this is "not simply something that white Americans owe to black Americans" - but "something

the entire nation owes to itself."

REACTION FOLLOW WHITE HOUSE

As for reaction to the President's stand - more good than bad, it would seem. In any event, Acting Attorney General Richard Kleindienst - moved quickly today to follow through on the President's directive. Announcing plans to file anti-busing suits in Richmond, Virginia also, Denver, Colorado.

Mrs. Beard in a signed statement said the controversial memo introduced into the Senate hearings is a forgery. Jack Anderson replies that if she said this under oath - she committed perjury. VIETNAM

In Vietnam - a U.S. patrol was ambushed today about twenty miles northeast in Saigon. A quick call for reienforcements - and a combat team was dispatched by helicopter. About half way there - the chopper exploding in mid-air then plunging into a river. Crew and passengers - eleven in all - apparently killed instantly. The patrol under fire, - later fighting its way to safety without a loss. **DUBLIN** - Vatican

St. Patrick's Day, Nineteen-Seventy-Two - inspite of all, a great day for the Irish. A big parade today - in Dublin; a bigger parade in New York; and similar celebrations whereever the Irish have roamed - right around the globe. Along with this, a special message from Pope Paul

- addressed to thepeople of all Ireland, expressing great sorrow - at the recent actions of Irish extremists. "The Christian faith must convince all concerned, says the Pope, "that violence is not an acceptable solution to the problems of Ireland."

DACCA

India's Prime Minister - Madame Indira Gandhi a visitor today for the first time to the new state of Bangladesh. At Dacca, receiving a thundrous welcome by an estimated half million Bengalis. Also a public expression of gratitude from Sheikh Mjuibur Rahman; for India's role, of course - in the birth of that nation.

And then Madame Ganhhi's turn. The lady premier observing that independence - is not an end in itself; but rather the means to an end - "to a better happier society." She also told the Bengalis: "We in India have chose a task - but now it is for you to choose yours;" to determine "yourself how to proceed - how to achieve your goals" how to build, in short, "a new society."

LAS VEGAS - VANCOUVER

From the Nevada Gaming Control Board - a call for a "face-to-face" meeting with famed billionaire Howard Hughes. This in connection with Hughes' request - for permission to re-organize his desert gambling kingdom. The Board noting that its handwriting experts - were the same ones originally used by the McGraw Hill publishing firm; adding, therefore, it can no longer rely on the authenticity - of handwritten documents. And now - from Vancouver -Hughes' response. In a word - "Never."

EL PASO

For the first time since the Korean War - Texas oil wells were authorized today to run "wide open." at full capacity. This - we are told - in order to enable the U.S. oil industry to fight off a recent flood of foreign oil imports. According to the Texas oil authorities, an historic occasion - and a sad one."

Chairman Byron Tunnell explained that Texas oil reserves - are running out fast. Said he: TExas oil fields have long been like a reliable old warrior rising to the task when needed; but that old warrior - just can't rise any more."
