Let that issue of civil rights was dominant in the Truman presidential campaign, a leading item among all the promises the President made.

The sharpness of the issue is illustrated by a disclosure made in Washington today. It is revealed that, y sterday, there was an angry flareup between

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Democratic National Chairman Senator McGrath and the leader of the big Negro organization, Walter White, Chairman of the National Association for advancement of colored people. The story, as told today, is that McGrath encountered Walter White in an ante-room a few steps from the Senate chamber, where the southern filibuster was going on. The leader of the Negro organization was in conversation with Democratic Senator Humphrey of Minnesota - that same Hubert Humphrey who broke the racial question wide open at the Democratic convention.

Remember that exciting day last June? Remember how a compromise appeared to have been reached between the Truman leaders and the Southerners on the subject of xx civil rights? But the delegate from minnesota, Hubert Humphrey went to the platform as a leader of liberal Democrats and stapped the convention with a fiery demand for an all-out racial plank. The plank was adopted; - which brought about the secession of the Dixiecrats.

In the election, Humphrey himself was chosen there he Senator - and now he ke was in conversation with Negro organization leader Walter White. So in came Democratic National Chairman Senator McGrath. We hear that McGrath was sore because White wook had been charging a democratic sell-out in the business of racial rights and the southern filibuster. They started talking, and White is said to have shown McGrath a press release he was about to issue. intimation was that the Truman administration was about to give up as on the anti-filibuster fight; and the press release called this " - Appomatox in reverse". The northern victory over slavery in the civil war - changed around.

The response of McGrath was violent. The

Democratic Mational Chairman brokeinto a loud and

angry tirade against the chairman of the National

Association for the advancement for colored people,

and charged him with conducting a whispering campaign

to newspapermen - whispering that the Truman leaders

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were selling out to the Negroes. McGrath told White that he was unfairly attacking democrats who, said McGrath, "have sweated and bled in your cause."

The leader of the Negro organization is described as making no response, as McGrath went on and on until he was quieted down by Democratic Senator Myers of Pennsylvania who intervened.

This Washington story of flaring temper might well be an illustration of the desperation of the Truman leaders who have lost control of Congress to an alliance of Republicans and Southerners.

Europe had a bad case of the war jitters today. Three There was a feeling across the continent that a diplomatic crisis with, Russia was in the making.

The dispatch goes on to say that diplomatic circles expect a new Soviet push in the cold war, and they believe it will happen this coming summer - with Russian moves in the Mear East most likely. Right now Moscow is putting pressure on Iran, this featured by a violent praps propaganda campaign. The Persian government today described the Rad press and radio insults as being beyond - "civilized standards."

It all sounds like a prelude to Soviet activity in the direction of 'ran, and today an official of the foreign office at Teheran said that his country should join the line-up of western powers by making a military alliance with the ka United States.

Still more to the point is the news of the

formation of a western power defense program - a master plan for developing the military paux power of the free nations. This was drawn up at a meeting in London.

The military Chiefs of Great Britain, Belgium. Holland and Luxemburg have completed a two-day meeting - under conditions of what amounted to war time secrecy. They drew up a program for each country to arm as fast im as it can. Each is to manufacture all the weapons it can - the United States to be asked to provide additional armament. We hear that the secret defense conference - drawing up a master plan, went so far as to choose a military line to be held, in case of war with the Soviet Russia a line from Switzerland along the Rhine, to the North Sea.

Great britain is taking the lead in the international re-armament, the London government announces that the British jet fighter strength is being doubled - rushing production of jet planes.

Britain has agreed to let France manufacture the British Vampire jet fighters - so that France may equip its Air Force with jet speedsters that fly at five hundred thirty one miles an hour. This master defense plan is preparation for the expected this summer. The view is that the western powers had better have plenty of guns and planes when the crisis comes. Ther they will be in a position to sit down and talk with Stalin, that he understand the language of guns and planes. From "ashington we have comment on the jitters reported in Europe. American diplomatic and military officials agree in the expectation that there will be a new rise of East-West tension, but they do not think the Soviets are in any position to risk a war.
