Egypt's Anwar Sadat, - ~~the~~ first Egyptian leader ever to visit the White House; ~~was~~ ^{ed} receiving a warm welcome today from President Ford. - who said his visit symbolizes the "new dimensions of our friendship." Sadat ⁱⁿ ~~replying by~~ saying he had come to the U S - "to put the relations between our two countries in proper order." Adding: "We are here - with a open heart."

The two then holding the first - of two days of scheduled meetings - White House spokesman Ron Nessen saying they discussed mainly - the search for peace in the middle east and the ~~strengthening~~ strengthening of U S and Egyptian relations. The President pledging - we are told - ~~we will~~ ^{to} ask Congress for money to help the Egyptian economy.

At Lop Nor in Sinkiang Province - Red China

device. The blast heard first by western listening
posts - and ~~then~~ confirmed by Peking; ^{This} Red China's
first nuclear test - in more than a year; with a
magnitude of about twenty kilotons, ~~--- or the~~ same
as ~~that of~~ ^{as} the Hiroshima bomb. "~~It would appear~~"
- Said one military source - ^{also} "the Chinese may be
testing smaller, tactical war-heads."

MORRISTOWN

In the "right to die" trial at Morristown

MANILA

A top aide to President Marcos of the Philippines was shot to death today in his office at Manila's ~~Malacanang~~ Malacanang Palace. Police saying: "There is no evidence of any political implications." ~~but this is being looked into."~~

TOMONOCO

Seventy persons were reported killed today -- in a plane crash near the resort city of Tomonoco in Bolivia. The plane filled with Bolivian army officers and their families - returning to LaPaz after a weekend outing.

DRUGS
