Good Evening Everybody:

The optimism in Moscow over the success of the nuclear test ban talks - greater than ever tonight.

Harriman, Hailsham - and Gromyko - talking privately over dinner. After a three hour meeting

and amid a flurry of reports that a draft treaty - is

already drawn up, to ban tests under water, in the atmosphere and in outer space, and already has been

dispatched to Washington and London - to be approved by the American and British governments.

By tomorrow, or Wednesday, the world should know, say the experts, if the first agreement between the East and West on the subject of nuclear testing - has been reached. A historic moment - if it comes, as many now expect it will.

## RAILS

President Kennedy held a bi-partisan Congressional meeting today to brief Democratic and Republican leaders - on his proposal for settling the rail dispute - to avert a nation-wide strike.

And he also outlined his proposal - to management and labor spokesmen, after negotiators on both sides had turned thumbs down at any last minute agreement.

Mr. Kennedy asking Congress - to refer the dispute to the Interstate Commerce Commission. Asking it also to pass legislation to prevent a nation-wide strike - while the Commerce Commission is straightening out the dispute.

This is a "single shot proposal" - Democratic leader Mike Mansfield told newsmen, designed to give the I.C.C. - authority to settle the dispute. He says it is not compulsory arbitration, or seizure of the railroads. Simply legislation to keep collective bargaining going - and "give precedent to I.C.C. proposals"

## GOVERNORS

WHEN GOVERNOR ROSELLINI OF WASHINGTON GAVELLED THE CONFERENCE OF GOVERNORS TO ORDER IN MIAMI BEACH, EVERYONE KNEW WHAT THE TWO MAIN ISSUES WOULD BE. CIVIL RIGHTS - AND THE QUESTION OF ROCKEFELLER VERSUS GOLDWATER - AS POSSIBLE G.O.P. CANDIDATES.

GOVERNOR ROCKEFELLER LOST NO TIME IN PUSHING FOR - A VOTE BY THE GOVERNORS ON THE ISSUE OF CIVIL RIGHTS.

BUT THEY DECIDED - NOT TO VOTE. IN FACT, THEY ABOLISHED THEIR RESOLUTION COMMITTEE. APPROVING INSTEAD, BY THIRTY-THREE VOTES TO SIXTEEN, THE PLAN OF GOVERNOR GRANT SAWYER OF NEVADA - TO ABOLISH THE RESOLUTIONS COMMITTEE, AND THUS KEEP SOUTHERN GOVERNORS FROM FILIBUSTERING - ON CIVIL RIGHTS.

THE PLAN WOULD ALSO ALLOW GOVERNORS TO DEBATE FREELY WITHOUT - AS GOVERNOR SAWYER PUT IT - "BALLET DANCING AROUND AN ISSUE."
