Good Evening Everybody:
The optimism in Moscow over the success of the nuclear test ban talks - greater than ever tonight. Harriman, Hailsham - and uromyko - talking privately over dinner. After a three hour meeting and amid a flurry of reports that a draft treaty - is already drawn up, to ban tests under water, in the atmosphere and in outer space, and already has been dispatched to Washington and London - to be approved by the American and British governments.

By tomorrow, or Wednesday, the world should know, say the experts, if the first $a_{5}$ reement between the East and West on the subject of nuclear testing has been reached. A historic moment - if it comes, as many now expect it will.

## BAILS

President Kennedy held a bipartisan Congressional meeting today to brief Democratic and Republican leaders - on his proposal for settling the rail dispute - to avert a nation-wide strike.

And he also outlined his proposal - to management and labor spokesmen, after negotiators on both sides had turned thumbs down at any last minute agreement.

Mr. Kennedy asking Congress - to refer the dispute to the Interstate Commerce Commission. Asking it also to pass legislation to prevent a nation-wide strike - while the Commerce Commission is straightening out the dispute.

This is a "single shot proposal" - Democratic leader Mike Mansfield told newsmen, designed to give the I.C.C. - authority tc settle the dispute.
