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There was a terrific explosion in New York today. Bighteen huge tanks of the Stenderd oil Compeny caught fire and blew un. The explosion occured in the borough of Brooklyn. A fire started end then those tanks went off one after another, like gigantic fire-crackers. According to the Associated Press, the oil $\mathbf{x i x}$ even spread into the East River, and then thr river caught fire. The flames spread to piers and warehouses and for a time the whole williemsburg section of Brooklyn wes in dencer. Thirty-five $\mathbf{x x}$ engines and fifteen fire boats battled the flames and one fire bost got trapped in the flames and started to blaze.

The demage is estimated at two million dollars.

Down in Brazil they had a terrific explosion, too. Tons of munitions blew sup. Scores of buildings were blown to abits and the United Press reports that sthirty people were killed, among them many soldiers who took part in the recent revolution. A director of a lead${ }^{\text {ing }}$ Rio de Janeiro newspaper and his family ${ }^{9}$ are reported to have been wiped out.

That earthquake I told you about last night, the observatory, well, the scientists were right. It occured a long way off. Away at out in Burma. In fact it shook the famous old Moulmein Pagoda and was felt all the wy from Rangoon to Mandalay.

Two shocks were felt down in Albuqueque, New Mexico, and gave the folks a good scare. But the seismogranh recorded a far heavier series of shocks, and the experts figured that they were a long, long distance from this continent.

Well, the big quake turns out to have occured in Burma, and the United Press cables that whole towns were destroyed. Some twenty odd persons were killed and perhaps a hundred other injured at the town of pya, which is one hundred and fifty miles north of Rangoon.

The natives out there give a strange explanation of the
