This was election day in France. Five-hundred-forty_
four seats in the National Assembly - to be filled. And there were nearly six thousand candidates - of eighteen different parties. Which certainly should have been enough to confuse the French voters.


The total vote was a record-breaker. The registration two million more voters than before. Of which unusually high percentage cast their ballots today. Of a total registration, fifty-four percent - are women. So the speculation is - what does it all mean?

One thing appears to be certain - that the Communists will increase their representation in the National Assembly. Because - of a split in the moderate parties. The feud between Premier Edmund Faure and his predecessor, Mendes-France. In addition to the voting in Metropolitan France, this was election day in the French Colonial possessions. Which elect fifty deputies in the National Assembly.

In French Equatorial Africa, there's one candidate who has been dead for thirteen years. The Prophet Matswa - who founded a weird sect. He died in Nineteen-Forty-Fwo but his followers wont believe it. They consider him immortal - and think he remains alive.


Paris, and they isacointorote $C$ for the long deceased Prophet Matswa.

Early returns show the moderate parties running strongly -- the Catholic Popular Republicans -- fifty-five thousand. Socialists - twenty thousand -- radicals - eighteen thousand. Communists twenty four thousand.

The anti tax agitators entered by Poujade - twelve thousand -- which is a strong showing in these fragmentary figures.

## NORTH AFRICA FOLLOW FRANCE

It might have been election day in French North

African possessions, but a lot of people were saying it with bullets, not ballots. The French Commander reports heavy fighting in the mountains of Morocco. Troops, backed by tanks and war planes - in clashes with anti-French insurgents.

Reports are that a hundred rebels were killed in the last three days.
Similar battles in Algeria - which is legally, a part
of metropolitan France. French troops - versus the fanatics


London has a report - that Generalissimo Chang Kail
Shek is negotiating with the Chinese Reds. Today, the Dally
Herald, newspaper of the Labor Party, states: "Information
reaching London suggests - that secret negotiations between
China and Peiping were as opened some weeks ago."
The British Foreign office says - it has no knowledge high
of this. But official ${ }^{5}$ quenteve in London admit - they do not rule out the possibility.

The London Daily Herald goes on to say that Chang
Kali Sheik is worried. Believing that world opinion is against him - and there may be a switch of American policy.

The Prime Minister put the situation between Israel and the Arabs in these words: "In this confused, crazy, electrified atmosphere, any spark in any quarter - may ignite a conflagration of unforeseeable extent and results. We shall," Ben Gurion added, "have been grievously at fault - if we are not prepared for any eventuality."

At the same time, he called earnestly for peace.

Taking it for granted that Israel would win in a war against the Arabs, he declared" "We know that, after our victory in round one - a second round is possible. And, after our victory in the second round - a third round may come. Ante there no end to the business.
"We believe" he summarized, "that the maintenance of peace is preferable - even to victory."

Meanwhile, Israel, today charged - that Egyptian
jet fighters penetrated Israeli territory along the border of the Gaza strip. And - that Egyptian soldiers on the with
ground fired at Israelis - in that same area.- no casualties.

There was a quick change in Britain today - in the matter of British firms exporting surplus British armament. Recently, it was disclosed - that obsolete military equipment was being shipped to Egypt. So, over the weekend, the London government - slapped on a ban. Unless - private exporters could give a guarantee that the surplus weapons would not be used in an arms race.

Then, today, suddenly, the ban was called off.

The cencellation coming - in a policy declaration from Sir Anthony Eden. According to a new ruling, Private exporters are permitted to purchase amounts of surplus arms. But a guarantee will be required from any lantg foreign government purchasing such surplus. The Fek Foreign government - called upon to give assurances that the weapons will not be used in an arms race.

Sounds odd. Why would Egypt, for example, be buying military equipment Except - for an arms race?
