GOOD EVENING EVERYBODY:

I am broadcasting from the Seattle-Tacoma airport tonight on a one-stop flight from New York to Alaska. Actually I am on the air over the facilities of KIRO, Seattle, one of the best known radio stations here in the West.

On the flight out to Puget Sound, on the Northwest Airlines plane a number of passengers asked me one of two questions I am asked wherever I go the question: "When are you going to give us another High Adventure Series, on TV -- in color?" The answer is, I am busy on a new series now. In fact, I was in Europe last week putting the final touches to parts of this -- including one on the Himalayas and another on a remote part of Burma.

The second question I am asked everywhere, is: "May I go along and carry your bags"-- or some variation.

STORM

Winter arrived in full force today for much of the Nation -- arrived a day ahead of the official advent of the season. A cold wave sweeping across the Northern plain -- all the way to New England. With resulting snow storms in Minnesota, Wisconsin and Illinois -- and a mading of twenty-six below at Wanakena, New York. More snow and cold -- predicted for tonight.

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DESPITE EXTRAORDINARY RECAUTIONS -- INCLUDING A STRICT CURFEW --ON U S MILITARY PERSONNEL, COMMUNIST TERRORISTS STRUCK AGAIN TODAY IN AND AROUND SEGON, AS PART OF THE OBSERVANCE OF THE FIFTH ANNIVERSARY --OF THE VIET CONG'S SO-CALLED "NATIONAL LIBERATION FRONT".

HIGHER THE CAPITOL --- A HAND GRENADE HURLED AT A U.S. ARMY TRUCK. WOUNDING FIVE AMERICAN SOLDIERS, -- SEVEN VIBTNAMESE, CIVILIANS. ON THE OUTSKIRTS OF THE CITY - ABOUT A HUNDRED GUERILLAS INFLICTED HEAVY CASUALTIES ON A GOVERNMENT OUTPOST -- COMMENT A FUEL DESS. WHILE AT NEAR-BY BIEN HOA -- FOUR AMERICAN CONSTRUCTION WORKERS APPARENTLY WERE KIDNAPPED --- WHILE WORKING AT A ROCK QUARRY. NO WORD THEIR FATE.

PEACE

In Washington today, the United States officially "welcomed" the new appeal of Pope Paul -- for peace in Vietnam. White House Press Secretary Bill Moyers asserting that " we share in the Pope's concern -- and identify with his objectives;" notably, an end to the conflict -- and an end to the despair of war. Moyers adding that the President -- like the Pope --"is hopeful that the conflict can be resolved." He also said : "Our posture remains the same. We will talk unconditionally any time the other side is ready."

CHINA FOLLOW PEACE

A later report from Peking indicates that the Communists are anything but ready -- to talk peace in Vietnam.

Red China's Premier Chou En-lai declaring today -- that apparent U.S. willingness to talk peace -- is merely a trick, as he put it -- to cover up American preparations for expanding the war. Chou further warning that if America wants "another trial of strength" -- as he put it -- then Red China is prepared to "fight to the end."

ERHARD

West German Chancellor Ludwig Erhard -- arrived in Washington today, to press his demand for an expanded German role in NATO Nuclear Defenses.

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INDIA FOLLOW ERHARD

President Johnson also conferred today -- with Indian Food Minister Subramanium; about the "immediate" threat of famine -- in the wake of India's worst drought in fifty years. Subramanim reporting that India will need at least ten million tons of wheat and other grains -- to meet the present emergency.

Secretary of Agriculture Freeman -- attended the meeting and later said the President had ordered him to assist India without delay. RHODESIA

France and Italy join United States today -- in full support of Britain's oil embargo on rebellious Rhodesia. This according to an announcement -- by British Prime Minister Wilson.

DOMINICAN

American and Brazilian troops stepped in today -- to break up anumber of small scale riots in downtown Santo Domingo. Prompt action by the inter-American forces.-- possibly preventing a repeat of weekend violence at nearby Santiago. The Brazilians -- using tear gas to disburse the mob. U.S. soldiers virtually unopposed -- as they completed the job of clearing the streets.

ISSIONARY
