Mansfield pointed to the new policy of protective reaction instead of maximum pressure as the basis for his belief. Commenting on that, the White House says no orders for a ceasefire have been given.

The Administration told Congress during the day that it will raise the monthly Medicare health insurance charge from four dollars to something over five dollars - **mentage** next July First. This - in order to keep pace with soaring medical costs.

And the President hinted that he will veto a bill - now pending on Capitol Hill - that calls for an average forty-six percent boost in veterans' educational benefits. Mr. Nixon
